*To the Honorable Common Council of
the City of Ann Arbor:*

The undersigned persons being owners of property on Block No. three (3) south of Huron St., in Range No. three (3) east in the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and desiring to have the alley running partly through the center of said Block north and south extended through from Liberty St. to Williams St., and adopted by the city as a public alley, therefore, your petitioners hereby respectfully request your honorable body to lay out, establish and adopt an alley through said Block running from Liberty St. south to Williams St., which alley as to its width, general direction and location is described as follows, viz:

The center line of said alley shall commence at the center line of said Block on the north side of said Block, and the south boundary line of Liberty St., running thence south along about the center line of said Block, as said alley is now established and used, until it strikes the north boundary of the south half of lot No. eleven (11) in said Block, thence west on the north boundary line of the south half of said lot No. eleven until it strikes the private alley 12 feet wide now running from that point south to Williams St., the said alley to be 16 feet wide, as now established and used, from Liberty St. until it strikes the north end of said 12 foot alley as now established, being at the north boundary of the south half of said lot No. six in said Block. And said alley shall be 12 feet wide from the north boundary of the south half of lot No. six of said Block, it being the lot now owned by Frederick Helber and by Gruner, Treadwell and, Cheever, south until it reaches Williams St. In case it shall be necessary, the whole of said alley across the east end of the land of said Christian Spæth may be laid upon his land and from the west boundary of the land of the Misses Willards to said 12 foot alley, one-half of said alley may be laid upon the land of said Christian Spæth and one-half upon the lands of Gruner, Treadwell and Cheever. The said 12 foot alley to be laid out and established as now located

On the 9th. day of April, 1896, the Council passed a resolution directing you to draw an order on the Treasurer for \$4500.00 to purchase a part of lot one, block one, south of Huron-st. range 5 east from the Lucy W. S. Morgan Est., whenever I should examine the title and report the same to be free and clear.

I have made a carefull examination of an abstract of the property, and find that Mrs. Morgan obtained title from one, John M. Case, to the property in question, on the 23rd. day of May, 1845 and it has remained in her name from that time to the present time, a period of 51 years.

Some time, on or about May 12th., 1896, one, Lucy C. Eames obtained an injunction from the circuit court in Chancery of the County of Kalamazoo, forbidding Otis C. Johnson, surviving executor and trustee of the estate of the said Lucy W. S. Morgan, deceased, among other things, from transferring the property in question. On the 21st. day of May, 1896 the Honorable Geo. M. Buck, circuit Judge of said court issued an order modifying said injunction permitting said Otis C.
