I have your note of the 15th. inst.

This Company will feel that its interests require it to oppose any further opening of streets in your city on the grade of its track.

We believe that at no distant date the sentiment of your people will require a separation of the grade of your streets and this company's rail.

With this end in view we think it necessary that no more streets shall be opened on the grade of this Company's track except at such compensation to the Company as will cover the entire cost of any future separation of the street and the track.

I regret very much that I cannot take a view of your request which will be more agreeable to your citizens.

It will be noticed that there are no contagious diseases, excepting tuber culosis, mentioned. There have been 34 inspections made this month and nearly all of such nuisances have been abated. Your board has held three regular and four special meetings during the month.
