Mayor Copeland appeared before the Council and stated that owing to several cases of smallpox in the different cities, and the liability of some of it being brought back when the students returned from their spring vacation, that it would be wise for the Council to give the Board of Health power to secure a house for a detention hospital.

Upon motion of Ald. Coon the Board was given authority to secure such a house by the following vote:

By Ald. Coon:

Resolved, that the street commissioner be directed to examine all dangerous and defective walks and report same to the council. Further, that he be ordered to tear up all exceedingly dangerous ones immediately, especially the walks in front of the Pistorious and Sorg property, which we declare is dangerous and a new walk is a public necessity in these two places.
