To the Common Council:

The undersigned, city clerk, begs leave to submit the following as the report of the proceedings of the Board of Review, having under consideration the review of the several sidewalks constructed by the board of public works in the city of Ann Arbor at the expense of the street fund:

The council sitting as such Board of Review in pursuance to its order and appointment for that purpose, met

at the council chamber on Friday, the 31st day of October, at 2 o'clock p.m., 1902, and due proof of the publication of the notice of the meeting filed.

The roll of aldermen being called, and the quorum being found present, the chairman duly elected for the Board of Review and the certificate of the board of public works being presented, the council entered upon the consideration of the same, and as no person appeared in opposition, the following resolution was offered:

By Ald. Clancy:

Resolved, that, whereas, the certificate of the board of public works for the construction at the expense of the street fund, of the several sidewalks therein mentioned having been duly certified to us and this day having been appointed and assigned for the purpose of reviewing the same, and no person opposing, and the said certificate having been duly considered and the review thereof completed, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the city clerk is ordered to report the proceedings of the Board of Review on said certificate, to the common council at the next regular meeting thereof. Adopted.

By Ald. Clancy:

Resolved, that temporary walks be laid over culverts being built until spring. Carried.

Resolved, That the board of public works place tile drainways in gutter on Summit street, north side, to accommodate property between Main street and Ann Arbor railroad.

By Ald. Clancy:

Resolved, that the board of public works replank the M. C. railroad bridge on Detroit street. Also that the board of public works and street commissioner see that the chuck holes in the streets throughout the city be filled with gravel before cold weather. Carried.

By Ald. Hamilton:

Resolved, that the resolution passed two weeks ago relative to blanketing the headlights on the D., Y., A. A. & J. cars be reconsidered and laid upon the table. Carried.

By Ald. Schlenker:

Resolved, That the voting machine will remain in the Second ward building permanently; be it further resolved, that the city clerk cause the amount of insurance on the voting machine to be transferred from the Sixth ward engine house to said Second ward building. Carried.

The City Physician's report was received and placed on file.

By Ald. Fischer:

Resolved, That the Detroit, Ypsilanti, Ann Arbor & Jackson Railway be instructed and are hereby ordered to reduce the strength of their headlights on their interurban cars while passing through the city one-half of the strength thereof. Carried.

By Ald. Burg:

Resolved, That the city clerk order two car loads of brick for cross walks. Carried.
