SIDEWALK COMMITTEE REPORT

Ann Arbor, May 7, 1903.

To the Honroable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your committee on sidewalks have had the following walks under consideration and we find that they are in a dangerous condition and would recommend that they be torn up at once:

No. 1404 to 1440 (inclusive), Broadway, east side.

South of 1427 and in front of 1441 Broadway, west side.

No. 1628 to 1666 (inclusive), Broadway, east side.

No. 1667 Broadway, west side.

South side of Moore street off Broadway, and No. 504 Fuller street, south side.

East side of Fifth avenue, corner of Detroit street.

No. 710 Miller avenue, north side.

West side of Ninth street, off West Huron street.

No. 1111 West Huron street, south side.

No. 323 South Seventh street, east side.

No. 929 West Liberty street to end of sidewalk.

South side of West Jefferson street, west of Fourth street.

Twelfth street University property, off N. University avenue.

We also recommend an appropriation be made to grade east side of Seventh street off Huron street to the north line of No. 204.

We have also had the matter of the grade of the sidewalk on north side of Washtenaw avenue under consideration and would recommend that the grade of Washtenaw avenue from the south line of Vinewood boulevard to the west line of Wayne street be changed, fixed and established as of-

fered by resolution at regular session of council April 20, 1903.

ORDINANCE.

Ald. Fischer presented an ordinance to amend Section 3 of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to sidewalks."

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 3 of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance relative to sidewalks," passed March 6, 1893, approved March 11, 1893, as amended by an ordinance passed February 17, 1896, approved February 18, 1896, as amended by an ordinance passed July 18, 1898, approved July 21, 1898, as amended by an ordinance passed April 16, 1900, approved April 18, 1900, as amended by an ordinance passed September 16, 1901.

The common council of the city of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That section three of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance relative to sidewalks," passed March 6, 1893, approved March 11, 1893, as amended by an ordinance passed February 17, 1896, approved February 18, 1896, as amended by an ordinance passed July 18, 1898, approved July 21, 1898, as amended by an ordinance passed April 16, 1900, approved April 18, 1900, as amended by an ordinance passed September 16, 1901, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 3. Within the limits hereby specified all sidewalks shall hereafter be constructed of stone flagging of artificial stone (cement) and of no other material, towit:

On Main street between Packard and Catherine streets; on Ashley street between Huron and William streets; on Fourth avenue between Packard and Catherine streets; on Division street between Detroit and Packard streets; on State street between Fuller and Packard streets; on Ann street between Ashley and State streets; on Washington. Liberty and William Ashley streets between and State streets: on east side of Dtroit street between Fourth avenue and Depot street; on both sides of the North, East and South University avenues, adjoining the University grounds or campus. and on the east side of Washtenaw avenue, between East University avenue and Hill street; on the south side of Hill street between Packard and Sybil streets; and all other sidewalks within the district bounded and enclosed by the following streets and parts of streets, to-wit:

Main street from Packard to Catherine. Catherine street from Main to Division, Division street from Catherine to Kingsley street, Kingsley from Division to Ingalls, Ingalls street from Kingsley to Huron, Huron street from Ingalls to Twelfth, Twelfth street from Huron to North University avenue. North University avenue from Twelfth to Washtenaw avenue, Washtenaw avenue from North University avenue to Hill street, Hill street from Washtenaw avenue to East University avenue, East University avenue from Hill street to Tappan street, Tappan street from East University avenue to Oakland avenue, Oakland avenue from Tappan street to Arch street, all of Arch street, Packard street from Arch to Main, and also upon Geddes avenue from Washtenaw avenue to Observatory street, shall be constructed of stone flagging or artificial stone (cement).

Provided, however, that the Common Council shall have power and au-

thority in its discretion to authorize 3,000 cu. the construction or repair of a tar or asphaltum sidewalk on and along any street or avenue aforesaid within the district aforesaid. Upon all other streets, avenues or parts of streets within the city, sidewalks shall be constructed, repaired and renewed of stone flagging, artificial stone (cement), tar or asphaltum, or other material as ordered and required by the Common Council, and all work done and all material shall be in all things firstclass, and satisfactory to the Board of Public Works.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

Given its first reading by title and passed to second reading.

CHARTER AMENDMENTS.

To the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor.

Gentlemen — Your committee to whom is referred the subject of the revision and amendments of the City Charter of the City of Ann Arbor, beg leave to report that they have had the

same under consideration and recommend that a bill be prepared and presented to the legislature of the State of Michigan at its present session amending the Charter as follows:

- 1. To provide for a police commission that shall have full power and control of the police department.
- 2. That the mayor, president of the council and aldermen shall each be paid a salary of one hundred dollars a year, payable quarterly, which shall be in full for all services pertaining to their respective offices.
- 3. That the salary of the City Assessor shall be fifteen hundred dollars per year which shall be in full for all services pertaining to said office.
- 4. That the Common Council may define and designate, by ordinance, that portion of the city in which the business of selling or offering for sale spirituous or intoxicating liquors may be carried on and to prohibit the sale or offering for sale spirituous and intoxicating liquors in all other portions or parts of said city of Ann Arbor.
