Your committee to whom was referred the matter of widening out Division street, between Madison and Hill Sts., have had the matter under consideration and beg leave to report the following: that, after a personal inspection, the committee cannot see that any great improvement will be made by widening the street—and would therefore disapprove of the same.

As to the matter of Tappan street, in reference to extension of the lawn your committee beg leave to report: after a personal inspection and after having a talk with a number of property owners on the street we agreed to compromise the request made by them in their petition. We would therefore recommend that the property owners on Tappan street, from Hill to Oakland avenue be allowed to make an extension of two (2) feet on each side of the street, having a twenty-nine foot street, providing that the property owners will build a uniform cement gutter and curb-stone, subject to the approval of the Board of Public Works.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
