Act amending the charter of the C.ty of Ann Arbor presented by Ald. Fischer.

AN ACT to amend sections s'xty-nine. one hundred thirty-six, one hundred thirty-seven, one hundred seventyone, of act number three hundred thirty-one of the local acts of Michigan, of 1889, entitled "An Act to reincorporate the City of Ann Arbor, revise the charter of said city and repeal all conflicting acts relating thereto," approved March fifteenth, eighteen hundred and eighty-nine as amended and revised by the several acts amendatory and revisionary thereof, and to add twelve new sections to be known as sections one hundred eighteen a, one hundred eighteen b, one hundred eighteen c, one hundred eighteen d. o e hundred eighteen e, one hundred eighteen f, one hundred eightcep g, one hundred eighteen h, one hundred eightern i one hundred eighteen j, one hundred eighteen k, and section one hundred twentyfour a.

The People of the State of Michigan enact;

Section 1. That section sixty-nine, one hundred thirty-six, one hundred thirty-reven and one hundred seventyone of an act entitled "An Act to reincorporate the City of Ann Arbor, revise the charter of the said city and repeal all conflicing acts relating thereto," being act three hundred

thirty-one of the local acts of Michigan of 1889, approved March 15th, 1889, as amended and revised by the several ac.s amendatory and revisionary thereof, be and the same are hereby amended and that there shall be added thereto twelve new sections to be known as sections one hundred eighteen a, one hundred eighteen b. one hundred eighteen c, one hundred eighteen d, one hundred eighteen e, one hundred e ghieen f, one hundred eghteen g, one hundred eighteen h, one hundred e ghteen i, one hundred eighteen j, one hundred eighteen k, and section or e hundred twenty fo ra.

fee ion 69. The officers of said corroration shall be entitled to receive out of the city traising the following suns in full payment of the'r service : The mayor shall be paid ore dollar jer annum; city cle k shal receive one thousand five hundred dollars per annum, which shall be in full for his services as well as the services of a deputy, of clerk hire, cr other assi tarce required in the pe formance of the d tes of his office; the city attorney shall receive six hundred dolla s fer annum; the treasurer shall be e titled to receive such som as the common council shall a'low, n t exc edi g one hundred dol as recarnum Povided, That the sad treaturer shall be entitled to recrive, in addition to such salary the ices he citafter povided for c llecting the tixes to be levied and co'lected in the said city. The marshal sh ll be entilled to receive such compensation not exleading eight - three and thirty three one hundredths dollars per month, as the common coun cl shall alow; the assessor shall receive one thousand five hundred dallars per annum; the justices of the peace and the constables shall be a'lowed the same fees as are by law to corresponding township allowed officers; superviors and all other cffors of said ciy shal be en i.led to such compensation receive as the common council shall allow, not exceed ng two dollars per day for every cay act ally employed in the performance of the duties of their respective offices; Provided further, That the common council may increase the compensat on of any officer when ever authorized thereto by majority vote of the qualified electors of the said city voting at any annual charter election, ten days notice having been given of the proposed increase.

tertion 1189. All real estate now owned by the City of Ann Arbor and ded cated to park purposes, including all properties, buildings and improvements of every kind connected therewith together with all property that may hereafter be acquired for park purposes, and all hwn extensions and shade theer, shall be under the exclusive control of five commissioners who shall be elect rs and actual residents of the spid city and shall be known and de ignated is "The Board of Purk Commissioners of the City of Ann Arbor."

Sec i n 118b. The members of sad bcard shall be app inted by the maycr of said city on the first Monday in Ma of each year, or within a reaso able time there ter, and in accordance with the provisions of sector, thirty-o. e of the Charter of said city, relative to appointments by the mayor; the full t rm of each member shall be five years, from the first Monday in May of the year in which lenay be appointed and until his successor is appointed and qualified, exce t as hereinafter specially provideî. Whenever the te m of office (f iny member sh ll ex ire, his success r shall be appointed by the mayor, as herein provided, and his term of office shall date from the expiration of the term of office of the member where he succeeds. The members of the said board shall devote all the time necessary to a proper discharge of the duties of their offices, and shall serve without par. At the first meeting of the said board after the first Monday in May of each year the member whose term of office shall soonest exp re shall be precident cf the board for that year.

Section 11Sc. Immediately af er

Section 118d. The common council shall provide an appropriation in its annual budget for the year, 1905, for the care mantenance, improvements or extensions of parks. It shall be the duty of said board to prepare and submit to this common council for its ra i cat on or amendment, on or bfore the first Monday in June, each year, e timates for the care, mainterance improvements or extensions of the said rarks. Such est mates shall specify in detail the objects of the e-perditures, the sum de ired for each and any special reasons the board may have for defiring the same. The arount of m ney which the common council shall dete m ne by resolution to be necessary shall be certified b the city clerk to the city assessor with the other amounts determined to be raised by trx for the city s'reets, sewe s, and other purposes in accordance with the provisions of the charter of the C ty of Ann Arbor.

Section 118e. The said board shall pay to the city treasurer all mone s received from any source relating to soid parks, who shall receive such moncy and place the same in a fund to be called the park fund. All expenses incurred by the board on account of rarks shall be passed upon by it, certified to by the president thereof, and fled with the city clerk who shall contify the same to the com mon courcl for payment, and in cree the matter of expense involved is in cluded in the annual budget, herein shrubs, plants flowers or other things

the common council shall order the payment of the same. In case the matter of expense is not therein included the common council shall take such action in relation thereto as it may deem proper.

Section 118f. No debt or liability of any kind shall be created by said board on account of parks in excess of the annual budget and money in said park fund unless specially authorized so to do by the major ty elect of the common council. The said board may accept donations or bequeits of money or property which shall be used for the maintenance and improvements of said parks as cortemplated by such donation cr bequest.

Section Said 118g. board shall have lower to engage or appoint all employees on the parks and fix their compensation. It shall have power to appoint a superintendent $\mathbf{o}_{\mathbf{f}}$ parks who shall not be a member of sa'd board, and fix his salary. Such superintendent shall hold his position during the pleasure of said board.

118h. Said Sec ion board shall have exclusive control over all improvements in a y of the s id parks; also the construction of all buildings and the maintenance thereof within said parks, and the core and trimming of all shade trees within said city.

Section 118i. The said board may make all needful rules and regulators the ma agement, maintenance 1 or and care of rarks and regulate their ure; and the common council of srid city may provide ordinances for the observation of the same; and may also, in like manner, provide for the observation and enforcement of any other rules and regulations duly made by the said board, under any provisions of this act; and said common council may by ordinance previde the p⁻e⁻ervation for and protection of the parks and any of the prope ty in charge of sail b ard against any destruction or injury, and prevent the destruction or injury to or taking of any trees.

The said board shall clasify the various works under its control, and keep an accurate account of the cost of each and of the amounts expended for construction, regains, superintendence and sala iss of employees, and, also, detailed acco ints of all other matters under its clarge and con'rol, and upon the second Morday in May in the year, 1906, and on the second Monday in May, in every ye r thereafter, and oftener i, required by the common co n cil, sh-ll submit to it a statement. showing in (e ail, the progress and co di ion (f 'll the public improvments commenced or carried forward by sad to rd; the character and aro ints (f all contracts made by the board: the no es earned and paid ther on and all other i formation recessive to the full understanding o, the bu iness conducted by said bord.

The city engineer Section 118k shall perform such services as may be required of him by the said b ard; the cty attorney shall be the legal adv ser of said board and the ciy clerk shall be the clark of said blard.

Section 124a. Whenever the parties owning a majority of the property in any proposed storm sewer district shall petition the common council to construct storm sewars in said d strict, t may or er the improvement made and acsers the whole or any part of the cort of the same against the property in said district included in the pelion, and all proceedings

for the construction of said storm sewers shall be the same as that for the construction of lateral sewers in said city.

Section 136. Said board of public works shall, after the said public improvements have been first duly ordered b7 the common council have supervision and charge of the con_truction and re; air of sidewalks, cellars all under sidewalks, crosswalks, culverts, bridges, p atforms, iountrirs. and reserthe constr c ion, repair and vo ra: extension of all the main and lateral sewers and drains; the erection, al'eration and repar of all engine houses. police station, ci y halls, and other public buildings of every description in said city ex ept school houses and buildings for wate works; the d e e ng and cleaning of ditches and gutters; the cleaning, repairing, grading, planking graveling or covering with other material of all streets and alle s; and sh ll in addition thereto. exerci e such other power and perform such other duties in the superintendence, construc ion and care of public wo k3 and improvements as the common council may from time to time by ordinance direct. Said board public works may recommend a of change of grades for street, alleys, lanes, and sidewaks to the common council, but shall make no change in the es ablished grades of any stretta, elleys, lener, gut e s, or sidewalks of the ciy wihout the consent of the common courcl, made in pursuance of an ordinance of the ctr establishrg all said grades. All plats or adi ions to the city shall be first subrited to the bord of public works for its approval before the same are recorded.

Fertion 137. Whenever the c mmen corneil of the said city shall hare discided upon the making of any public improvement, it shall so declare by refoluti n and shall refer the matter to the board of public works and such o her board or boards is may be intere ted therein, and said board or boards, with all converient

dispatch, shall determine as to the particular kind of materials to be used therefor, and estimate, in detail the q an ity of materials, the probable cost and expense of such work and of the materials, and make a record thereof in their office, and caute to be prepared, so far as necesplays and specifications s⁻ry. for such work or improvement, and repart the determination and estimate to the common council. When such pans a d specifications have been submitted to the common council, and approved by it, the said board of p blic works shall except in the case of cleaning the ditches and gutters and the repair of stree's and sidewalks, adventise for proposals for furnishing of materials and for the perf rmance of such work; and may require all bidders to furni h security for the re-formance of any contract awarded to them; and al bids submitted to said bcard shall be publicly opened by it, and, as so n thereafter as may be, reported by the said board to the c mmon council together with its reconmendation in respect thereio; and no contract shall be let by the said beard until duly authorized by the common cour ci¹. Said board shall have the right to reject any and all b'ds made and in case all b'ds are rejected, the board may then advertise a second time or perform such work and furnish the materials itself. And if the board shall dec de to perform sich and furn sh the materials it work shall be the duty of the board to communicate in wriing to the common council, at its earliest opportunity, its determination so to do; and after the completion of such work, at its erliest opportunity, the board shall make an itemized r port in writing to the common councl of all money expended by it in the prosecution of such work, and the purchase of such mate ial, stating there in for whit partic lar purpose sid money was expended. No expenditures for any purdollars pcse exceeding twenty-five shall be made by the said board ex-

cept by consent of the common council.

Section 171. The common council shall have authority to assess, levy, and collect taxes on all the real and perso al estate taxable in said city, which tax shall be and remain a lien upon the property so assessed until the same shall be paid: Provided, that the aggregate amount which the council may raise by general tax upon the taxable real and pers nal property for the purpose for which the several general funds are hereinafter constituted shall not, except as herein otherwise provided exceed in any one year three-fourths of one per cent on the assessed value of all the real, and personal property in the city made taxable by liw: And Provided Further, that nothing herein conta ned shall be so construed as to prohibit the common counc l of said city from regulating by tax or otherwise the business of dealing in malt, spirituous or ntoxicating liquors.
