Ald. Markey presented an ordinance to amend Section 2 of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to provide for licensing and regulating roller skating rinks, and to control location thereof."

Ald. Coon read the ordinance as follows: An ordinance to amend Section 2 of an ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE to provide for licensing and regulating roller skating rinks, and to control the location thereof.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. Applications for such license shall be in writing, and shall state the place where it is proposed to carry on said business, the names of the person or persons who shall conduct said business, and, if a corporation, the names of the officers thereof, and their places of residence; such application shall also state the distance from the place where it is proposed to carry on the business of such roller skating rink to the nearest dwelling house. Such application shall be signed by the proprietor of such roller skating rink, or the person or persons who are to conduct the same, and shall be filed with the city clerk, who shall present it at the next meeting of the common council. Such application shall be referred to a committee of said common council to be appointed by the president, who shall report on the advisability of granting such license not later than
