I will sell to the city of Ann Arbor  
the property at the corner of Ann street  
and Fourth avenue, fronting 86 feet on

000, and as part payment will take the  
present city lot at \$5,000, and if neces-  
sary also the Rohde lot as \$3,300.

Whereas local act No. 293 of the legislature of Michigan, approved February 25, 1901, authorizes the city of Ann Arbor to build and construct a

suitable building for a city hall, to purchase land therefor and to raise the money by tax and loan (said sum of money not exceeding thirty thousand dollars) and

Whereas, At a special election held in the city of Ann Arbor, state of Michigan, September 6, 1906, the qualified electors of the said city did vote to authorize a loan for the construction of a city hall and to purchase land, therefore,
