Communication from the Mayor

Mr. President and Members of the
Council:

Gentlemen:—I presume that I am
expected, in accordance with what I
understand is the custom on assuming
the duties of Mayor of Ann Arbor, to
give to your honorable body such rec-
ommendations pertaining to the city
affairs as may seem to me to be proper.
But I desire to say that at this time I
have no special policy to outline and no
specific recommendations to make
for your consideration. I credit you,
gentlemen, who have already had ex-
perience as members of the council,
with the possession of a much more inti-
mate acquaintance with the city's af-
fairs and needs than I have at this time
and I consider it therefore incumbent
upon me to defer my recommendations
until I better acquaint myself with what
you are already so familiar with.

I regard the government of the city as
a business proposition and I shall earn-
estly strive with your valuable assistance
to give to Ann Arbor a businesslike
administration of her municipal affairs.
I shall be guided in the discharge of my
duties as Mayor by those principles
which make for a successful adminis-
tration of private business, and shall
from time to time recommend to your
consideration such matters as the city's
well being and progress shall seem to
me to require.

In the selection of appointees for the
various departments of the city's
work, my aim shall be to secure men
of such character and ability as will
insure the faithful, reasonable and
proper discharge of duties of the res-
pective positions to the satisfaction of
the people generally and the credit and
orderly life of the city. And as to this
end, and that all of our endeavors may
make for the best interest of our civic
life, I desire and ask for your co-opera-
tion and generous support.
