#### Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Manwaring presented an ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance Relative to Street Railways" which was given its third reading as follows:

#### An Ordinance Relative to Street Railways.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor Ordain:

Sec. 1. That on and after the taking effect of this ordinance, the Detroit, Jackson & Chicago Railway Co., its successors or assigns, shall run its cars on Packard street, between Main street and the city limits, between the hours of 7 A. M. and 8 P. M. daily, every thirty minutes.

Sec. 2. For each and every day on which the Detroit, Jackson & Chicago Railway Co., its successors or assigns, shall refuse or neglect to provide the service herein ordered, said company may be complained of as for a distinct offense, and punished as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 3. Any person, company or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to the City of Ann Arbor in the penal sum of fifty dollars and cost of suit, to be recovered in an action of assumpsit for money had and received in any court of competent jurisdiction.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Your committee on sidewalks respectfully recommend the construction of a new walk on the north side of West Huron street in front of the property of Mrs. Edmunds. Also a new walk on the west side of Eighth street from West Washington street south along the land of Mrs. Edmunds and Breisch's land, and a new sidewalk along the north side of Madison street from Fourth avenue west to Main street; also a new walk on North side of Greenwood avenue in front of land of William Arnold; also recommend that a crosswalk be placed on the south side of West Huron street across Ninth street, and that the dirt be cleaned off the sidewalk on the south side of Israel avenue from Martin street east about ten rods. Repair sidewalk in front of 430 Second street, Fred Helber's place.
