Gentlemen: Your Committee on Poor have thoroughly investigated the matter of wood purchased by the Poor Commissioner and find that wood has been received from several persons and thrown in same pile in the City Yards. As there has been wood taken from the pile and delivered to measured, there is no way to determine just how much wood has been delivered to the city by any party. We feel that Mr. Cavanaugh delivered his wood as ordered and in good faith, and therefore recommend that rule No. 21 be suspended for the evening and the City Clerk authorized to draw a warrant in favor of Jas. Cavanaugh for the amount of his bill, \$467.50. We further recommend that hereafter when any amount of for city use wood is necessary that the Poor Commissioner so state in communication to the council and this body make appropriation or take such action as they think best in the matter, and all wood so purchased be corded in the City Yards by person delivering same.
