Engineer's Report on Bridges.

Hon. Common Council, City: Gentlemen—In accordance with your resolution, I herewith submit a general plan of a two span reinforced concrete bridge, to be erected over the Huron river on Wall street. This bridge can be built for approximately \$8,000.00.

A two span, truss bridge, with plank floor, can be built for approximately \$4,400.00, using the present pier and abutments, while a two span, plate girder, with concrete roadway, using the present pier and abutments, can be built for approximately \$6,000.00.

For moving the present Broadway bridge to Wall street, I estimate as follows:

Taking down and re-erecting bridge.	\$1,800.00
1 new pier and 2 abutments	900.00
Temporary bridge on Broadway to take care of traffic	800.00

Total. \$3,500.00

If it is thought advisable to move the Broadway bridge, I would suggest that bids be asked from reputable bridge companies for doing the work.
