From Board of Public Works.

Report of Special Committee on Bridge.

Ann Arbor, Mich., Mar. 16, 1910.

Board of Public Works, Ann Arbor, Mich.: Gentlemen—Your committee, to whom was referred the various plans and bids received March 9, for a concrete bridge over the Huron river at Wall st., beg to report that we have considered the various proposals, and recommend that the plan and bid submitted by The Herman Tapp Construction Co., of Fort Wayne, Ind., be recommended to the council.

We estimate the total cost of this bridge as follows:

Contract price	\$7,650.00
1,200 bbls. cement @ \$1.17..	1,404.00
Cartage on cement.....	60.00

Total estimated cost.....\$9,114.00

Any piling required will be extra.

By Mr. Scott: Whereas, the Board of Public Works have had the proposals of twelve different contractors under consideration for the construction of a concrete bridge over the Huron river at Wall st., and finding that of The Herman Tapp Construction Company of Fort Wayne, Ind., best suited to the city's needs, therefore

Resolved, that this Board recommends to the common council the acceptance of the proposal of The Herman Tapp Construction Co., for the

construction of a reinforced concrete bridge over the Huron river at Wall st., according to plans and specifications in the Engineer's office, at \$7,650.00, and that said company be awarded the contract. Adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 5.

Report and action of Board of Public Works received and following resolution offered:

By Ald. Sherk: Resolved, That the council concur in the recommendation of the Board of Public Works, relative to Wall st. bridge, and that the President of the Board and City Clerk sign contract with The Herman Tapp Construction Co., for the construction of proposed bridge, according to plans and specifications presented here tonight, upon the filing of bonds satisfactory to the City Attorney and President of the Board. Resolved, further, that the Board of Public Works proceed with the construction of said bridge with all convenient dispatch. Provided, the bridge shall be ready for the city to gravel or pave, on or before the first day of August, 1910, with a penalty of \$50.00 per day for each and every day that the bridge shall remain incomplete, as above provided, after that date.
