**Ordinance Committee.**

Ald. Manwaring presented an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to sprinkling the street railway tracks on West Huron Street, Main Street and Packard Street, Ann Arbor, Michigan," which was given its third reading as follows:

An ordinance relative to sprinkling the street railway tracks on West Huron street, Main street and Packard street, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

The common council of the city of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. Any company or corporation operating the street railway line on West Huron st., Main st. and Packard st., in the city of Ann Arbor; on West Huron st. between Main st. and the city limits, and on Main st. from West Huron st. to Packard st., and on Packard st. to city limits, shall at all times from the first day of April to the first day of November in each year cause that portion of said streets over which its cars are operated, to be sprinkled with water between the rails and for 18 inches outside the rails to such an extent as to lay the dust.

Sec. 2. Any street railway corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to the city of Ann Arbor in the penal sum of \$50, and cost of suit, for each day or part of day during the time aforesaid that said sprinkling shall be neglected, to be recovered in an action of assumpsit for money had and received in any court of competent jurisdiction.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ten days from legal publication.

The common council of the city of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. That section one of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance to

Prohibit the Firing of Firearms Within the Limits of the City of Ann Arbor," passed December 21, 1896; approved December 22, 1896, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows.

Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to fire any cannon, revolver, pistol, gun, air gun, spring gun, or any other species of firearms within the limits of the city of Ann Arbor, excepting by the written permission of the mayor, which permission shall limit the time of such firing, and shall be subject to be revoked at any time by the common council.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

**Charter Amendment.**

By Ald. Manwaring: Resolved, that section 56 of the charter of the city of Ann Arbor, as amended March 28th, 1891, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 56. The justices of the peace in said city, exercising civil jurisdiction, shall be deemed justices of the peace of Washtenaw county, and shall have all the powers and jurisdiction given by the general laws of the state in relation to civil and criminal cases before justices of the peace in townships, and appeals from their judgments and convictions may be made to the circuit court for the county of Washtenaw in the same manner as appeals from justices' judgment and convictions in towns are made: Provided, That all actions within the jurisdiction of justices of the peace may be commenced and prosecuted in said justices' court, when the plaintiff or defendant or one of the plaintiffs or defendants reside in the city of Ann Arbor, in the township of Ann Arbor, in any township next adjoining the township of Ann Arbor, or in any city or village formed from any township next adjoining the township of Ann Arbor: Provided, That the township of Ypsilanti shall be deemed to be a township adjoining the township of Ann Arbor within the meaning of this act; Provided, further, That the common council of the city of Ann Arbor may by ordinance establish and organize a municipal court and provide for its officers, jurisdiction and powers.
