ing the office of Commissioner for the

Destruction of Noxious Weeds, in

accordance with the provisions of Act

249, Public Acts of 1897, as amended.

This Ordinance shall take effect and

be in force on and after ten days from

legal publication.

“Gentlemen:—The foregoing figures show the amount of money necessary in each fund to take care of contracts already made by the city and the natural running expenses for the ensuing year. The amount to be raised in the general funds can not exceed \$64,000.00. The amount necessary to take care of the city hall, armory, pavement and sewer bonds and interest due August 1st, is indicated in those funds. The amount shown, in the uncollected city tax fund is amount not yet collected on last year's tax levy. The amount shown in the bridge, culvert and cross-walk fund is necessary to take care of the streets, side-walks, storm sewers, cross-walks, bridges and culverts, purchase material for general street work, pay salaries and labor on above work and take care of emergencies. The amounts shown will not take care of any overdrawn funds, but will take care of actual expense of year. Any unusual improvement contemplated such as auto trucks for fire department, auto patrol for police department, improvement of water supply and any other expenditures of size should be provided for and money raised by special tax before contract is ordered signed. This can be done only by vote of people. The natural increase in expenses is greater at present time than the natural increase in assessments.
