Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of Liberty st. within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore,

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the common council to cause Liberty street, within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved, under the charter and ordinances of the city of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.
