

Council Chamber, Ann Arbor, Mich., Sept. 6th, 1911. Adjourned regular session.

Meeting called to order by President Mills. Present: Pres. Mills, Ald. Schmid, Sweet, Koernke, Pipp, Ramsay, Lutz, Lindenschmitt, 8. Absent: Ald. Murray, Hochrein, Flynn, Sherk, Manwaring, Goodyear, 6. Minutes of previous meeting approved.

Communications.

Ann Arbor, Mich., Sept. 6, 1911.

To the common council; Gentlemen—I have in my possession three wagons that will, on the expiration of my contract, Sept 15, for the collection of garbage, become the property of the city. Kindly name the place and I will deliver the said wagons promptly. Yours very respectfully, John W. Markey.

Moved by Ald. Lutz: That wagons be delivered at city yards. Adopted.

The city clerk presented correspondence between the city and Detroit, Jackson & Chicago railway, relative to Packard street pavement, as follows:

City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, August 23, 1911.

Mr. F. W. Brooks, President Detroit, Jackson & Chicago railway, Detroit, Michigan: Dear Sir—This city has made arrangements to and will start laying the concrete for pavement on South Main and Packard sts. tomorrow. You are requested to comply with the proposition made by the council July 3rd, 1911. Your company seem to have accepted the same, as the passing tracks are being laid. You are therefore asked to pave said streets between the rails and 18 inches outside each rail. This is positively necessary and should be done at once.

Resolution of July 3rd, 1911, attached:

By Alderman Manwaring: Resolved, That the request of Detroit, Jackson & Chicago railway Co., for turnouts on Packard st. as set forth in their application, be granted, upon the condition, and with the distinct understanding and agreement that said railway company shall, without delay, pave South Main st. and Packard st. between the rails, and that no cars be stored on said turnouts, said turnouts to be located and put down under the supervision of the city engineer.

Ald. Sweet moved, as an amendment, that the words "and 18 inches outside each rail," be inserted after the words "between the rails."

Amendment adopted as follows: Yeas—Ald. Pipp, Flynn, Sherk, Koernke, Manwaring, Sweet, Hochrein, Ramsay, Lutz, Schmid, Lindenschmitt, O'Connor, Pres. Mills—13. Nays—None. (Ald. Goodyear absent from the room at time vote was taken.) (Re-enter Ald. Goodyear.)

Resolution, as amended: Resolved, That the request of Detroit, Jackson & Chicago railway Co., for turnouts on Packard st. as set forth in their application, be granted, upon the condition, and with the distinct understanding and agreement that said railway Co. shall, without delay, pave South Main st. and Packard st. between the rails and 18 inches outside each rail, and that no cars be stored on said turnouts, said turnouts to be located and put down under the supervision of the city engineer.

Detroit, Jackson & Chicago railway, Detroit, Mich., August 24, 1911.

Ross Granger, Esq., City Clerk, Ann Arbor, Mich.: Dear sir—I am in receipt of your favor of the 23rd inst. Some weeks ago I advised the common council that we could not assume the burden of paving outside the rails of our track on South Main and Packard sts. I think the council understands that our contracts do not obligate us to do any of the paving work that we have done in Ann Arbor, and that we are not in a position to assume the city's burden to any greater extent than we have already done.

Communication from Street Commissioner.

Ann Arbor, Mich., Sept. 5, 1911.

To the Hon. Common Council, Gentlemen—Attention has been called to the sidewalk ordered on the north side of Hiscock st. from Kuster's walk to the south side of Summit st. on July 6, 1909. At that time the matter was taken up with the aldermen from the ward, and I estimated that the necessary grading, before the walk could be built, would cost between \$500.00 and \$600.00. As the sidewalk fund was at that time nearly exhausted, it was decided to allow the matter to rest. Subsequent action by council on Sept. 20, 1909, put off the building of the walk till the spring of 1910. At that time the sidewalk appropriation was again overdrawn, and nothing

was done. I now await your further order in the matter.

In the matter of sidewalk grading, I may add that practically none has been done this year, beyond finishing some work on Ferdon road, etc., commenced last year; also that nearly all the sidewalk grading which has been done was from filling obtained from the grading of streets for new pavements.

I desire also to call attention to the sidewalk ordered along the triangle at Washtenaw av., Baldwin av. and Cambridge road, which has not been included in the city clerk's recent advertisement for bids for building sidewalks ordered but not constructed by the property owners. The grading of this piece has been partly done, but I was informed by several of the property owners that action was about to be taken to make over or sell this piece of property to the city for park purposes, and that the sidewalk building ought not to be forced

through until this contemplated action had been decided one way or the other.
