Poor Committee

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your committee, to whom was referred the bill of Homeopathic hospital for private room and nurse for city charge, have investigated the same, and respectfully recommend that the bill be allowed, and warrant ordered drawn for \$11.60. We also recommend that the bill of Koch & Nichols for \$13.50, balance due for rental of wheel chair, be allowed and warrant ordered drawn for same.

Resolutions

Ald. Lutz called attention to the unsightly legal notices on telephone poles about the city. Ald. Manwaring moved that the matter be referred to the street committee. Adopted.

By Ald. Manwaring: Resolved, that the proposed amendment to the charter, providing for the raising by general tax for the regular city funds three-fourths of one per cent. in place of one-half of one per cent, on the assessed valuation of all real and personal property in the city; and the proposed charter amendment authorizing, by a three-fifths vote of the electors of the city, the issuing of bonds for public improvements; and the proposed charter amendment, whereby the city can build or purchase water works plant for supplying the inhabitants with water for domestic use and other purposes, and to borrow money and issue bonds for the payment thereof, be submitted to the electors of the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, at a special election to be held in the city hall voting room, on the 4th day of December, 1911.

Resolved, further, that said vote shall be by ballot and such ballot shall read as follows:

"For the maximum rate of taxation for the general city funds, three-fourths of one per cent—YES.

For the maximum rate of taxation for the general city funds, three-fourths of one per cent—NO."

"For power to issue bonds for any public purpose—Yes.

For power to issue bonds for any public purpose—NO."

"For power to build or purchase water works plant and issue bonds therefor—YES.

For power to build or purchase water works plant and issue bonds therefor—NO."

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Pipp, Flynn, Sherk, Koernke, Manwaring, Hochrein, Ramsay, Murray, Lutz, Schmid, Lindenschmitt, Pres. Mills, 12. Nays, none.

By. Ald. Pipp: Resolved, that the city clerk make all necessary arrangements for proposed election to be held in the city on the 4th day of December, 1911, and the chair appoint three members of the council

to act as election inspectors the day above named, and the said inspectors shall appoint the necessary clerks and gate keepers.

Resolved, further, that the polls for said election be open from 8 o'clock a. m. to 5 o'clock p. m.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Pipp, Flynn, Sherk, Koernke, Manwaring, Hochrein, Ramsay, Murray, Lutz, Schmid, Lindenschmitt, Pres. Mills, 12. Nays, none.
