Ann Arbor, Mich., June 29th, 1912.

To the Honorable Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor. Gentlemen—Under the decree of the circuit court by which the city purchased the old fair ground property, it was agreed that a suitable barn should be maintained thereon for use of the Ann Arbor Driving club. Last fall this barn was struck by lightning and burnt, and the structure which replaced it has just been completed.

Fortunately the Driving club carried \$1,000.00 insurance on this building, which amount has been turned over to the city clerk. We attach hereto bill of Koch Brothers amounting to \$1,690.90, and recommend payment of the same from the park fund, to which has been credited \$1,000.00 above referred to. The contract has been completed in an entirely satisfactory manner and the building is an ornament and credit to the city park system.

from Tappan st. to Hill st., should be wet down or sprinkled, to the end that the health and comfort of the people may thereby be conserved, therefore,

Resolved, that under the provisions of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to street sprinkling and providing a method of raising by taxation the money to pay and defray the costs and expenses thereof," passed July 17th, 1899, and amended June 17th, 1912, the common council hereby determines that upon the petition of a majority of the foot frontage owners of the taxable land on the above mentioned streets, the said streets shall be sprinkled and wet down, and the costs and expenses therefor shall be assessed and taxed to the owner of the land benefitted thereby.

Resolved, further, that the lands abutting on Hill st. from the east line of Church st. to Tappan st. and Tappan st. from Hill st. to East University av. and East University av. from Tappan st. to Hill st. are hereby set aside as a special assessment district, to be known as Street Sprinkling District No. 13.

Resolved, further, that each and all of the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefitted by such street sprinkling, to the extent of the cost thereof, and all such lands shall constitute and all of the lands hereinafter mentioned are fixed and determined as the district and the special assessment district upon and against which shall be charged and assessed all the costs and expenses of such street sprinkling, that is to say: All that part of the city of Ann Arbor and all the land, tenements and premises situated in the city of Ann Arbor, state of Michigan, known and bounded as follows, to wit:

Entire block 1, G. D. Hill's addition.

Lots, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 24 and the No. 92 ft. of lot 23, B. 2, G. D. Hill's addition.

Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 64 Tappan Park.

Part of lot 1, Tappan Park, beginning at N. E. corner of lot 2, Tappan Park. N. W. on Tappan st. to s. line of Hill st., W. on Hill st. 74 ft., S. to S. E. line of lot 1, N. E. on this line to beginning.

Lots 6 and 7, B. 7 S., R. 12 E., alteration of Ann Arbor Land Co's add.

Lot 7, also lot 6, except the N. 43 ft. of the W. 100 ft. B. 7 S., R. 13 E., alteration of Ann Arbor Land Co's add.

Lot 6 also lots 7 and 8, except the

N. 132 ft., B. 4, R. S. Smith's 2nd add.

The S. part of lots 2 and 3, B. 3, R. S. Smith's 2nd add., beginning on the S. W. corner of lot 2, N. on Church st., 74 ft., E'ly to a point on the E. line of lot 3 69 1-2 ft. N. of Hill st., S. to Hill st., W. to beginning.
