Ann Arbor, Mich., July 31st, 1912. To the Hon. Common Council, Ann Arbor, Mich.: Sirs-On July 15th, 1912, I was instructed to prepare an estimate of the cost of taking up and relaying with a larger size of pipe the storm water sewer on Jefterson st. from Second st. to the creek. Upon investigation, however, I found that this sewer was a good 24-inch vitrified tile sewer, which should be ample to care for all the water which is emptied into it. This led to further investigation, and a stoppage was lo-cated in the sewer leading from the two catch basins on Second st. between Jefferson st. and Madison st. to the sewer on Jefferson st. Upon digging up a part of this sewer it was found to contain one small paint keg, about half a dozen tin cans varying in size from the ordinary canned fruit size to a large square maple syrup can, quite a number of sticks and small pieces of board, and a large All this has been supply of mud. cleaned out and the catch basins fixed with grating to remove such things from the water before it enters the sewer, and I believe that the condition will be relieved without the ex- resolution be laid on the table.
