Ald. Sink presented the following ordinance which was given its third reading:

An ordinance to repeal an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to prohibit and punish the operating of theaters and shows, for which an admission fee is charged, in violation of the Sabbath, within the limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan," passed January 13th, 1915, approved January 28th, 1915.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. That the ordinance passed on the 18th day of January, 1915; approved January 28th, 1915, prohibiting and punishing the operating of theaters and shows, for which an admission fee is charged, in violation of the Sabbath, within the limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after legal publication.

##### Sewer Boundary Sewer Committee.

By Ald. Sherk: Resolved, That each and all of the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefited by the construction of lateral sewer No. 64, to the extent of the cost thereof, street crossings excepted, and all such lands shall constitute

and all of the said lands hereinafter mentioned is fixed and determined as the district and special district upon and against which shall be assessed and charged all the costs and expenses of construction of such lateral sewer, that is to say:

Block 3 S, Range 1 W—Wm. S. Maynard's Addition. The south 43 feet of lot 6 and the north 37 feet of the west 115.5 feet of lot 7.

Block 3 S, Range 2 W—Wm. S. Maynard's Addition. The south 100 feet of lots 1 and 2. The south 40 feet of lots 7 and 8. The north 33 feet of the west 66 feet of lot 9.

Block 3 S, Range 3 W—Wm. S. Maynard's Second Addition. The south 92 feet of lot D and the south 40 feet of lot A.

Commencing at a point 163.3 feet, measured along the Northerly line of Packard Street, south easterly from the intersection of the south line of Granger Avenue with the north easterly line of Packard Street, thence east parallel with Granger Avenue 163 feet, thence south easterly parallel with Packard Street 245 feet, thence westerly parallel with Granger Avenue to the northerly line of Packard Street and north westerly along the said northerly line of Packard Street to the place of beginning.

Block 2 N, Range 2 E—Original plat of Ann Arbor—Lot 3 and the west 1-2 of lot 2.

Block 2 N, Range 1 E. Original plat of Ann Arbor—Beginning on the West line of N. First Street at the south line of Catherine St., thence west along the south line of Catherine St., 53 ft., thence south parallel to First Street 49 1-2 feet, thence west parallel to Catherine St. 13 ft, thence south parallel to First Street 108 feet, thence west parallel with Catherine Street 24 feet, thence, South parallel with First Street to the north line of Ann Street, thence east along the north line of Ann Street to the west

line of First Street and north along the west line of First Street to the place of beginning.

Resolved, further, that this resolution, order and determination be and the same is hereby certified to the City Assessor.

#### **Pavement Boundary's and Order of Assessment.**

By Ald. Sherk: Resolved, that the pavement on W. Ann St., District No. 32, within the City of Ann Arbor, heretofore ordered, in the opinion of the Common Council is and is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Resolved, further, that all the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefitted by the construction and completion of the pavement heretofore ordered and it is hereby ordered and determined that all the costs of the said public improvement street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of the

cost of said 'public improvement' accepted, shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the special district assessment hereinafter designated and the said special assessment district is hereby fixed as follows, to-wit:

All those certain pieces and parcels of land situated in the City of Ann Arbor, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan, as follows:

Block 1 N, Range 3 E—Original Plat of Ann Arbor. Lots 6 and 7 and the north 21 feet of lot 8 and of the east 12 feet of lot 5, excepting that part of said lots now used as a public alley.

Block 1 N, Range 2 E—Original Plat of Ann Arbor. Lots 6 and 7. The east 1-2 of lot 5 and the north 34 feet of lot 8.

Block 2 N, Range 3 E—Original Plat of Ann Arbor. Lot 1 and the south 22 feet of lot 2. The south 44 feet of lot 8.

Block 2 N, Range 2 E—Original Plat of Ann Arbor. Lots 1 and 8 and the east 1-2 of lot 2.

Resolved, further, that and this Common Council hereby requires and orders the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred Seventy Six and no-100 Dollars payable in ten equal annual installments with four per cent interest or, at the option of the tax payers, in one payment, to be raised by tax and a special assessment on and against the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements aforesaid and situated in the said special assessment district, and as a tax against the owners thereof. All to be assessed on and against said lands, tenements and premises according to the benefits coming to each parcel thereof from such local public improvement, and the City Assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sum of money as aforesaid on and against the lands and tenements aforesaid on and upon the special assessment roll for the paving district aforesaid and on and upon each and every of the regular assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor for the year and during which any such special assessment may be payable, until the whole of such special assessment shall be paid in full, all to be assessed in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

Resolved, further, that the sum of Five Hundred Sixty-nine and no-100 Dollars is hereby appropriated for the

purpose of defraying the cost of such public improvement at street and alley intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of costs of said public improvement; all of which sum of money in ten equal annual installments, with interest, be and the same is hereby ordered and required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, and on and against all the taxable property within the city in and during the period in which any part of this appropriation and assessment is or shall be payable.

Resolved, further, that the City Clerk do certify this determination and order of assessments to the City Assessor pursuant to law.

Adopted by unanimous vote of the Council 15.

#### **Pavement Boundary and Order of Assessment.**

By Ald. Sherk: Resolved, that the pavement on E. Jefferson St., District No. 33, within the City of Ann Arbor, heretofore ordered, in the opinion of the Common Council is and is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Resolved, further, that all the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefitted by the construction and completion of the pavement heretofore ordered and it is hereby ordered and determined that all the costs of the said public improvement street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of the cost of said public improvement excepted, shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the special district assessment hereinafter designated and the said special assessment district is hereby fixed as follows, to-wit:

All those certain pieces and parcels of land situated in the City of Ann Arbor, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan, as follows:

Block 4 S, Range 9 E—Ann Arbor Land Co.'s Addition. Lots 8, 9, 10, and the east 1-2 of lot 7 and the south 26 feet of the west 1-2 of lot 7.

Block 4 S, Range 8 E—Ann Arbor Land Co.'s Addition. Lots 8 and 9 and the south 54 feet of lots 7 and 10.

Block 4 S, Range 7 E—Ann Arbor Land Co.'s Addition. Lot 9, the south 52 feet of lot 8 and the south 30 feet of the east 1-2 of lot 10.

Block 4 S, Range 6 E—Original

Also, beginning at the intersection of the west line of Hamilton Place with the north line of Jefferson Street thence north along the west line of Hamilton Place 132 feet, thence west parallel to Jefferson Street 99 feet, thence south 42 feet, thence west 42 feet, thence south 34 feet, thence west 90 feet to the east line of Fifth Avenue, thence south along the east line of 5th Avenue, to the north line of Jefferson Street and east along the north line of Jefferson Street to the place of beginning.

All that strip of land lying between Block 5 S Range 6 E, Ann Arbor Land Company's Addition, and the south line of Jefferson Street.

Block 5 S, Range 6 E—Ann Arbor Land Co.'s Addition. The east 132 feet of lot 1 and the west 99 feet of lot 6.

Block 5 S, Range 7 E—Ann Arbor Land Co.'s Addition. Lots 1 and 16.

Block 5 S, Range 8 E—Ann Arbor Land Co.'s Addition. Lot 1 and the north 15 feet of lot 2. Lots 14, 15, and 16.

Block 5 S, Range 9 E—Between Ann Arbor Land Co.'s Addition and State Street. The north 99 feet of the east 247 1-2 feet and the north 363 feet of the west 82 1-2 feet of said block and range.

Resolved, further, that and this Common Council hereby requires and orders the sum of Five Thousand Two Hundred Ninety Two Dollars and Thirty Two cents payable in ten equal annual installments with four per cent interest or, at the option of the tax payers, in one payment, to be raised by tax and a special assessment on and against the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements aforesaid and situated in the said special assessment district, and as a tax against the owners thereof. All to be assessed on and against said lands, tenements and premises according to the benefits coming to each parcel

thereof from such local public improvement, and the City Assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sum of money as aforesaid on and against the lands and tenements aforesaid on and upon the special assessment roll for the paving district aforesaid and on and upon each and every of the regular assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor for the year and during which any such special assessment may be payable, until the whole of such special assessment shall be paid in full, all to be assessed in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

Resolved, further, that the sum of Three Thousand Seventy-seven Dollars and Sixty-eight cents is hereby appropriated for the purpose of defraying the cost of such public improvement at street and alley intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of costs of said public improvement all of which sum of money in ten equal annual installments, with interest, be and the same is hereby ordered and required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, and on and against all the taxable property within the said city in and during the period in which any part of this appropriation and assessment is or shall be payable.

Resolved, further, that the City Clerk do certify this determination and order of assessments to the City Assessor pursuant to law.

Adopted by unanimous vote of council, (15).

#### **Street Committee.**

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your Street committee have had the following under consideration and recommend:

1st. That the extension on the east side of city hall from a point about six feet north of present pavement south to driveway and city property not now covered on the south and west of city hall be paved under the direction of Street Commissioner.

#### City Attorney's Report.

Ann Arbor, Mich., June 21st, 1915.

To the Honorable, the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—In the matter of the suit of Gustave A. Schenk vs. the City of Ann Arbor, which matter was brought on for hearing on Tuesday, June 15th, last, on an order to show cause why an injunction should not issue to restrain the City in making the present test at the Steere Farm or using the water to supply the City, the matter being taken up in connection with the demur in the case of Frederick Osborn et al. vs. the City of Ann Arbor, et al., beg leave to report as follows:

That the Court has enjoined the city from any further operations on the Steere farm, after completion of the present test. As yet no disposition has been made, by the Court, of the Osborn case.

As the right of the City of Ann Arbor to take water from the Steere farm to the injury of adjoining land owners is a question which has never been directly before the court of last resort in this state, and as the rights of the city cannot be definitely de-

termined until a decision has been had from that court, it seems to me most desirable that this matter be brought before the Supreme Court of this state at the next October term and I would therefore request and respectfully recommend that I be authorized by your honorable body to take the necessary steps to have this matter reviewed by the Supreme Court.
