#### ORDINANCE COMMITTEE.

Ald. Sink presented an ordinance which was given its third reading as follows:

An Ordinance to Amend an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to Transient Traders," passed December 1, 1902; approved December 8, 1902.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. That Section 4 of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to Transient Traders," passed December 1, 1902, approved December 8, 1902, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4. The license fee required by this ordinance shall be as follows: For the right and privilege of selling goods at retail by sample, or by solicitors taking orders, \$25.00 per day for first five days and \$10.00 per day for each and every day in addition thereto.

For the right and privilege of selling goods from a stock actually kept on hand, from which selections are made by the purchaser, \$25.00 per day for first five days and \$10.00 for each and every day in addition thereto.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

Moved by Ald. Manwaring, that the ordinance be referred back to Ordinance Committee. Adopted.

#### STREET COMMITTEE.
