City of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—Your Committee appointed for the purpose of securing, if possible, better milk inspection, which said Committee was appointed under date of Sept. 5th, 1916, beg leave to report as follows:

We have had several meetings relative to a better milk inspection, and would recommend that the present milk ordinance be referred to the Ordinance committee for amendment along certain lines, which are known to the chairman of the Ordinance committee, and that this matter of the amendment be taken up at the earliest possible moment and report to this Council.

Your committee also had under consideration other matters looking to a more sanitary condition in the City of Ann Arbor, and we would recommend that a general inspection be made of all restaurants, boarding houses, bakeries, barns, and other buildings from which any contagious disease or any unsanitary condition might arise, and we deem it expedient at this time to have at least three inspectors employed to work out this general inspection, under the direction of the City Health Officer.

While it has not been definitely shown that any of the typhoid fever cases, which exist at the present time in the city of Ann Arbor, have arisen from any other source than from infected milk, still at the same time we believe it wise to ascertain to the best of our ability whether or not there might be any other source from which typhoid fever might be contracted.

This inspection would take perhaps a period of two weeks, and the health officer would need some funds at his disposal to carry on the inspection, and we would therefore recommend that the Council authorize the Health Officer and the Finance committee to carry on the inspection above referred to, under the direction of the Health Officer, and that they be allowed to expend a sum not to exceed one thousand dollars.

Trusting that this honorable body will take some favorable action on this recommendation, it is respectfully submitted. Committee: John A. Wessinger, Health Officer; C. A. Sink, Sam C. Andres, Frank B. DeVine, City Attorney.

Section 124a: Whenever the Common Council deems it advisable and necessary to construct any storm sewers, it shall so declare by resolution setting forth the boundaries of said proposed storm sewer district. It may order the improvement made and assess the whole or any part of the cost of the same against the property in said district, and all proceedings for the construction of said storm sewers shall be the same as that for the construction of lateral sewers in said city.

Resolved, that this proposed amendment be laid on the table for thirty days, and published in the Times News under the direction of the City Clerk.

It has been our intention since the adoption of the ordinance to comply with it. We have been prevented, however, in our efforts, owing to our inability to get the necessary material. Four cars in Ann Arbor have been equipped, one is now in the shop and the others will be brought in and equipped as soon as possible.

Our delay has been in obtaining compressors. We entered into a contract on March 4th, 1916, with the Ingersol-Rand Co., for the compressors. The Ingersol-Rand Co., advised us that they are unable to complete the order owing to the fact that they are unable to get motors from the Westinghouse Co.

We are doing everything possible to hurry along the shipment, and you may rest assured cars will be equipped as soon as material arrives.
