Ann Arbor, Mich., Oct. 16, 1916.

To the Honorable, the Committee of the Whole of the Council and the Water Commission of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—The undersigned, to whom was referred the location of the proposed water main, to improve the service in the southeastern part of the City, have the honor to report that so far as the questions of engineering involved are concerned, there would be no difficulty in coming to an agreement, but we realize that the

location to be selected is dependent, not only upon present engineering considerations, but upon the policy that is to be adopted in regard to further extensions of the water works system, and that these questions of policy are properly to be determined by others than ourselves, and we therefore recommend that provision be made for a bond issue of not less than \$75,000.00 for such water main, as requested by the Water Commission, said bonds to be issued at the earliest possible date, and construction work to be begun as soon as funds are available, and that the matter of precise location be referred back to the Water Commission, to be determined by it in conference with a committee of your Honorable Body.
