Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Sink presented an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Granting to the Washtenaw Gas company, its successors and assigns, permission to maintain and operate gas works in the city of Ann Arbor, and to repeal an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Relative to Gas Works," passed September 2nd, 1889; approved September 4th, 1889; amended April 5th, 1893; which was given its second reading and referred to the Ordinance committee by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Fiegel, Heusel, A. Lutz, Mayer, Heck, Andres, Flynn, Donnelly, Manwaring, Freeman, McGregor, Sink, Geo. Lutz, 13. Nays, none.

The following gentlemen addressed the Council relative to the ordinance: Louis C. Karpinski, Henry W. Douglas, Joseph Wellman, Edson R. Sunderland and City Attorney Frank B. DeVine.

Ald. Freeman presented an ordinance to provide a tribunal for hearing, investigating, reporting and advising upon complaints relative to the gas service and supply to the city and its inhabitants, and moved that it be referred to the Ordinance committee for consideration, and it was so referred.

Railway Committee.

Jan. 15, 1917.

To the Honorable Common Council, Ann Arbor, Mich.: Gentlemen—Your Railway committee respectfully recommends that:

1. That the electric light now at the southeast corner of the intersection of Liberty and First streets be moved to the northeast corner of said intersection.

2. That a night watchman be provided at the crossing of Liberty st. and the Ann Arbor railroad, at least until 10 p. m.

3. That the crossing of First street and the Ann Arbor Railway company's tracks be replanked, and the planking made ten feet longer.

4. That the crossing of William st. and the Ann Arbor Railroad be replanked, and the planking made the full width of roadway and sidewalks. This replanking and widening to include the freight sidings crossing this street.

5. That a day watchman be provided at the crossing of William st. and the Ann Arbor Railroad.

6. That the planking for the crossing of the sidewalk on the west side

of Ashley st. and the Ann Arbor Railroad, be hewn or otherwise leveled off to provide a reasonably smooth walk.

7. That the planking at the crossing of Ashley st. roadway and the Ann Arbor Railroad, be lengthened ten feet.

8. That the crossing of Jefferson st. and the Ann Arbor Railroad, be replanked, and the planking for roadway lengthened ten feet.

9. That a day watchman be provided to watch both the crossing of Ashley st. and of Jefferson st. and the Ann Arbor railroad.

10. That the crossing of Main st. and the Ann Arbor railroad, be replanked and the planking for roadway lengthened ten feet.

11. That the location of the hydrant on south Main st., near the crossing of the Ann Arbor railroad, be changed, to remove said hydrant from its present danger to traffic.

12. That the crossing of Madison st. and the Ann Arbor railroad, be replanked, and the planking for roadway lengthened ten feet. This planking and widening to include the siding to Sauer & Co.'s lumber sheds.

13. That the crossing of Broadway and the Michigan Central siding to the Ann Arbor Machine company's plant be replanked. On account of the tracks crossing the roadway diagonally at this point, it is of especial importance that the planking be laid in a way to provide a level crossing.

14. That the crossing of Cedar st. and the Ann Arbor railroad, be replanked, and the planking lengthened ten feet.

Police Committee.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen: Your Police committee, to whom was referred a resolution offered by Ald. Fiegel, relative to danger and traffic signals, beg leave to report that they have considered the same and unanimously recommend:

1. That school street signals be placed as follows a. Three on Wells st.,

near the Eberbach school. b. Two on N. Division st., near Jones school. (at intersections of Ann st. and Division st., at intersection of Kingsley and Division st.) c. Two on Miller ave., near the Mack school.

2. That the City limit signs—"speed limit ten miles an hour"—be placed at the city limits on W. Huron st., Packard st., West Liberty st., Main st., Washtenaw ave., Broadway and Pontiac sts.

3. That danger signals be placed at intersection of Liberty and S. State sts.

4. That traffic signals or "Stop" and "Go" signs be provided for three traffic officers.

5. School st. signals on Church and E. University ave., near the Tappan school.

Resolved that the above recommendations be concurred in.
