Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Sink presented the following which was given its third reading:

An ordinance relative to the changing of the names of certain streets in the city of Ann Arbor.

The Common Council of the city of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That the name of that portion of South Thayer st., south of the University Campus, be known as and be a continuation of Oakland ave.

Section 2. That that portion of South Ingalls street lying south of the University Campus, and the street heretofore known as Tappan street, are hereby changed and such streets shall hereafter be known as Tappan ave.

Section 3. That all of that portion of Twelfth street lying south of the University Campus, be and the same is hereby changed, and shall hereafter be known as Haven ave.

Section 4. That the names of the streets heretofore known as Edwin street and Phillip street, be and the same are hereby changed and such streets shall hereafter be known as Hoover avenue.

Section 5. That the name of the street heretofore known as Lincoln street, be and the same is hereby changed, and such street shall hereafter be known as Davis ave.

Section 6. That the name of the street heretofore known as North Park ave., be and the same is hereby changed, and such street shall

hereafter be known as and designated as Granger avenue.

Section 7. That the name of the street heretofore known as West street, running from South Main street west, be and the same is hereby changed, and such street shall hereafter be known and designated as Pauline boulevard.

Section 8. That the name of the street heretofore known as East University avenue, running from Granger avenue to the south city limits, be and the same is hereby changed, and such street shall hereafter be known and designated as Golden ave.

Section 9. That the name of the street heretofore known as Hiscock boulevard in the Second ward of said city of Ann Arbor, be and the same is hereby changed, and hereafter to be known and designated as Soule boulevard.

Section 10. That the name of the street heretofore known as Fourth avenue, south of Hill street, be and the same is hereby changed, and such street shall hereafter be known and designated as Greene street.

Section 11. That the name of the street heretofore known as First street, north of Summit street, be and the same is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known and designated as Daniel street.

Section 12. That the name of West Catherine street be changed to Miller avenue.

Section 13. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect from and after legal publication.

To the Hon. the Common Council of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—In the matter of the claim of Flora Osborn and Frederick Osborn against the city of Ann Arbor, which matter was taken up by the Council as a committee of the whole and by them referred to your Mayor and City Attorney, we beg leave to submit the following report:

We have been able to settle the claim with the Osborns for the sum of one thousand dollars, which will be in full of all past and future dam-

ages suffered by them by reason of any act done by the city of Ann Arbor, or which it may have already committed.

We feel that this is much more than the Osborns are entitled to, but owing to the fact that the citizens of the city are demanding that we obtain the water from the so-called Steere farm at the earliest opportunity, we feel that this settlement will avoid litigation which would involve the city for a period of at least a year and possibly longer, and in view of the fact that we have obtained, as part of the consideration of the settlement with the Osborns, their written consent and agreement that they will not apply to the courts for an injunction to prohibit the city from taking water from said land or make further tests, provided the city furnishes them in any manner which it deems wise a quantity of water equal to the amount that they receive or will receive at the time of such pumping or testing would start.

Upon this settlement being made, stipulations will be filed with the clerk of the Circuit Court dismissing both of the suits therein pending, which have been started by the Osborns again the city of Ann Arbor.

In view of the foregoing, we would respectfully recommend a settlement on this basis, which settlement seems to be in accord with the wish which you expressed at the meeting of the Council as a committee of the whole. Respectfully submitted, Ernst M. Wurster, Mayor, Frank B. Devine, City Attorney.
