Special Railway Committee

Mr. H. E. Riggs, Chairman of special railway committee presented the following report.

Ann Arbor, Mich., July 21, 1919.

To the Honorable, The Common Council, Ann Arbor, Michigan, Gentlemen: Your street railway special committee, to whom was referred the various matters in connection with the relation of the City of Ann Arbor with the Detroit, Jackson and Chicago railway, begs leave to submit the following report as to a part of the matters referred to it.

Track Reconstruction in Paving District.

Your committee has met with the General Manager and other officials of the Detroit, Jackson and Chicago railway, have presented to them the city's program for paving and have urged the immediate reconstruction of all tracks in the paving district.

General Manager Burdick states by the company in unpaved streets that it will be absclutely impossible and requests the co-operation of the to at once procure necessary rail and University authorities and the city au-

other material for all of the streets that it is contemplated to pave this year, but will agree to the following program:

1. He is willing to build a double track line on Main street between Packard and Huron, using 91 lb. rail with 9 in. of concrete under the ties on straight track, and 12 in. of concrete under the ties on speciar work.

2. He is willing to construct the tracks on Catherine street, both single track and double track at the switch using the same type of construction. The estimated cost of these two pieces of reconstruction is \$90,000.00.

On Detroit street and Jackson avenue, where it will be impossible tò secure the rail in time for paving this year, the company will, at their own expense, put in the necessary headers to permit the city's portion of the paving to proceed, will put their present track to proper line and surface and on the completion of the city's paving will fill in the tracks with crushed stone, oiled so that the street may be used until material can be secured for the reconstruction of the Street Railway tracks and the pavement of the Street Railway's portion of the street.

Mr. Brudick agrees to undertake this work just a. rapidly as funds can be provided and material secured, estimating that Jackson avenue can be completed in approximately one year, and Detroit street in approximately two years.

Extension of Lines-

Your committee, with Mr. Burdick, visited the suggested extension to the Fifth ward and the suggested extension towards the University hospital. Mr. Burdick stated that in his opinion the demand for a line to the University hospital was such as to require prompt action on part of the railway company, and agreed to at once send his engineers to make studies and surveys of various routes to this district. He further expressed his willingness to undertake the construction of this line, so that its completion might be secured at the time that the new hospital is ready for service, or approximately within two years. Mr. Burdick expressed a wish to build this line, using American Society 70 lb. new rail, and the construction used by the company in unpaved streets and requests the co-operation of the

thorities in establishing a paving program which wil insure the maintenance of gravel streets on this line for a period of years.

Mr. Burdick is of the opinion that the Fifth ward extension is not possible at the present time, but that it may be undertaken at some later date and in view of the complications with the Michigan Central bridge and pres ent financial diffic "lties, that it would not be wise to defer pavement or provide for this line at the present time. Franchise.—

The question of renewal of the expired franchise of the company was taken up. Mr. Burdick directed Mr. George Burke, of the firm of Cavanaugh & Burke, to confer with the City Attorney in case the council should direct the City Attorney to discuss and draft a new franchise.

Freight Lines—

There was no discussion of the freight situation at the meeting in Ann Arbor. The subject was briefly discussed in Detroit on July 17th. Mr. Burdick stated that he would have studies made of the situation and if possible methods of overcoming the objection to freight traffic in the city and take it up with the Council or with your committee at a later date. This question is one that properly belongs to the franchse discussion, and may be properly deferred.

In view of the expressed willingness of the Detroit, Jackson & Chicago Railway officials to co-operate with the Council and citizens of Ann Arbor to the extreme limit of their financial ability, and in view of their resognition of their obligatons to maintain local service and to maintain the tracks on their purely local lines good condition, and in view of in the further fact that thev claim no rights by reason of the new construction which they are undertaking, vour committee would respectfully recommend:

That the Detroit, 1. Jackson & Chicago Rail ay be ordered to at once proceed with the reconstruction of tracks and pavement on Main street and Catherine street, using the standard construction with 91 lb rail as it used in the City of Detroit, and in conformity with the standard plans of the company on file in the City Engineer's office, it being specifically understood that such constructon in no way grants the company any

rights in said streets other than such as they may now be possessed of.

2. Your committee would recommend that the Company be permitted to put their present tracks in Detroit street and Jackson avenue to proper line and surface to conform to the ' pavement, to provide at their own expense the necessary headers, and to fill such tracks with suitable material, it being expressly understood that such temporary construction is to be replaced by permanent construction of standard type within approximately one year on Jackson avenue and two years on Detroit street.

3. It is recommended that the Council direct City Attorney Devine to cooperate with Attorney Burke in the drafting of a new franchise for street railway in the City of Ann Arbor.

It is recommended that the Council refer back to the special committee the question of extensions ,and especially the one to the University hospital and that the committee be authorized to study with the railway officials proper route and type of construction for such extension.

5. It is recommended that the committee be directed to further study the question of freight traffic in the City of Ann Arbor, all of which is respectfully submitted.

H. E. RIGGS. Moved by Ald. Freeman, that report presented by Mr. H. E. Riggs be accepted and recommendations contained therein be approved upon condition that the railway company shall pave between their tracks and eigh:een inches outside of each rail, and the space between all side tracks and double tracks and maintain said pavement in a condition suitable to the Board of Public Works of the City of Ann Arbor, and upon the further condition that the railway company file with the City Clerk a writtent acceptance of the permit hereby granted.

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any firm, person or corporation, to obstruct in any manner any street or public thoroughfare within October 20th, 1913; which was given

Section 2. That all obstructions now in any street or public thoroughfare of the City of Ann Arbor, encumbering the portion used, or, intended for use for public traffic or the lawn extensions, be removed within three years from and after the

passage of this ordinance.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation, who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution, and the court before whom such conviction shall be had may make a further sentence that on default of the payment of such fine and costs within a time to be fixed by such court, the person so convicted shall be imprisoned in the county jail of Washtenaw County or the State prison unal such fine and costs be paid for a term not exceeding ninety days. Provided that every day which said obstruction shall be maincained after notice from the City Clerk or the officers designated by the Common Council, to the person maintaining obstruction, such shall be considered and treated as a separate violation of this ordinance.

Section 4. The duty of enforcing the provision of this ordinance is hereby vested in the Board of Public Works or such other officers, Boards or bodies as shall, from time to time, have jurisdiction over the public streets of the city.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in contravention with this ordinance are hereby repealed and all permits heretofore issued for the obstruction of any street or public thoroughfare are hereby rescinded.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.
