Communication from Washtenaw Auto Club, relative erecting a sign board near the forks of Dexter and Jackson aves., received and referred to Board of Public Works with power to act.

Petitions.

Petition of Horace Barnard et al., requesting that the Detroit, Jackson and Chicago Railway be required to pave between its tracks on Jackson ave., received and referred to Board of Public Works.

Petition of Frederick W. Stevens et al., that sidewalk be ordered built along the north side of J. E. Harkins property on Wells st., and on the west side of said property on Baldwin ave., also on north side of Burns Park on Wells st., received and referred to Sidewalk committee.

Petition of Henry A. Mager et al. that Fountain st. be treated with calcium chloride received and referred to City Engineer.

Enter Ald. Lucas and Ald. Freeman.

Ald. Lutz, Chairman of special committee, to whom was referred the matter of disposal of garbage, made oral report that committee met with Health Officer and Mr. H. H. Wagoner, and that Mr. Wag-

oner offered to continue the collection and disposal of garbage at \$1,000.00 per month. Dr. John A. Wessinger, Health Officer, addressed council relative the matter and also regarding the necessity of clerk and milk inspector in his Dept. Mr. H. H. Wagoner informed council that he would provide extra equipment and collect the garbage satisfactorily if given \$1,000 per month.

Exit Ald. Donnelly.

Moved by Ald. Freeman, that Chairman Lutz, Mayor Wurster and City Attorney DeVine make contract with Mr. H. H. Wagoner at \$1,000.00 per month, to take effect July 1, 1920, for collection and disposal of garbage until January 1, 1921, and after that date contract may be terminated by Mr. Wagoner or the city by giving 60 days' notice.
