#### Railway Committee.

Ald. Freeman, chairman of railway committee, made oral report of meeting on December 29, with Mr. L. J. Allen, chief engineer of the Ann Arbor Railroad company, and stated that Mr. Allen promised that the railway company would install and maintain wig-wag signals at Liberty and Madison street crossings with the understanding that flag man would not be required at Liberty street crossing after wig-wag signals are installed.

Moved by Ald. Freeman that council accept proposition of Ann Arbor Railroad company and matter of discontinuing flag man at Liberty street crossing be referred to ordinance committee.

Moved by Ald. Lutz that matter be referred back to railway committee to be submitted to the public utilities commission, which motion was adopted by unanimous vote of those present—13.

#### Special Committee Report.

To the Honorable, the Common Council, Ann Arbor, Mich.:

Gentlemen—We, the undersigned park, sanitary and finance committees of this council, who have had under consideration the matter of the garbage disposal for the city of Ann Arbor, beg leave to submit the following as our recommendation:

We recommend that the city clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for the collection and disposal of garbage for the city of Ann Arbor for a term of three years from and after the date of the contract to be entered into. The contractor to furnish a bond to the city of Ann Arbor in the penal sum of six thousand dollars, the condition of which shall be approved by the city attorney. The parties to accompany their bids by a certified check in the sum of 10

percent of their annual contract price.

We further recommend that the city clerk be authorized and directed to notify the present contractor that his contract will be terminated within sixty days from the date of the giving of such notice.
