Grooms et al. received by Council April 7, 1921, for pavement on State street, from Arch street to Dewey avenue, to be known as Pavement District No. 47. Certificate and petition ordered on file.

Whereas, This common council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the grading and paving of State street from Arch street to Dewey avenue, within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan; and whereas, the grading and paving of that part of State street, within limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore.

To the Honorable Common Council, City of Ann Arbor:

Gentlemen—In the matter of the claim of Bess Marie Elliott.

I have had the above entitled claim, which was referred to me by your honorable body, under date of May 16, 1921, under con-

sideration, and beg leave to report as follows:

I am of the opinion that no liability attaches to the City of Ann Arbor because of this injury. Section 100 of the charter of the City of Ann Arbor, as amended in 1913, provides, among other things, as follows:

"And, provided further, that no civil action shall be maintained against the city for damages or injuries to persons or property sustained in consequence of any street, highway, bridge, culvert, sidewalk or cross walk being defective, out of repair, unsafe, dangerous or obstructive, unless that it appear that written notice of the particular defective, unsafe, dangerous or obstructed condition of such street, highway, bridge, culvert, sidewalk or crosswalk was actually given to the Board of Public Works; and that there was a failure or neglect within a reasonable time after the giving of such notice to repair or remove the defect, danger or obstruction complained of."

No written notice having been received by the Board of Public Works of any defect in the street or sidewalk at the point where the injury is alleged to have occurred a suit for damages for injuries, such as is alleged to have resulted

because of said alleged defect, cannot therefore be maintained.
