Sewer Committee Report

To the Honorable the Common
 Council.

Gentlemen:

Your Sewer Committee, to whom was referred the estimates and reports of the City Engineer, relative to the construction of lateral sewers in Lateral Sewer Districts No. 118, on Krause street from Third street to Murray avenue; and No. 119, on Henry street from Packard street to Golden avenue and on Westminster place, Monclair place and Ferndale place from Henry street north 360 feet, begs leave to report that we have had such estimates and reports as well as the resolution of Council under consideration and have made inquiries relating hereto and have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of said lateral sewers in said districts, and recommends that special taxing or assessment districts be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of such sewers be charged, street intersections excepted, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided. Your committee further recommends that resolutions fixing the boundaries of said districts be prepared by the City Engineer, and the Board of Public Works ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of said sewers.

Your committee further recommends that a lateral sewer be constructed on Davis avenue from Main street to Hoover avenue, on Hoover avenue from Davis avenue to Fifth street and on Fifth street from Davis avenue to Pauline boulevard, and that the City Engineer be instructed to prepare plans, specifications and estimate of cost for said lateral sewer; and that the construction of said sewer is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Your committee further recommends that the Board of Public Works be instructed to plank the west side of the Westgate Manufacturing company's building with two-inch plank and clean out the adjoining creek and tile.
