No such building or other similar bulky or heavy object shall be halted for the night so as to obst uct any sidewalk or crosswalk, or in he intersection of streets and any sidecrosswalk curbing, payement or street surface disturbed encumbered, or injured in course of the said removal shall be promptly restored to a perfect condition, satisfact ry to the sad Board of Public Works by the sa d person firm or corporation.
