**Sewer Committee Report**  
To the Honorable, the Common  
Council,  
Gentlemen:

Your Sewer Committee to whom was referred the estimates and reports of the city engineer relative to the construction of lateral sewers in lateral sewer districts No. 141, on Brockman-blvd from Copley-av. southerly 475 feet; No. 142, on Mt. Vernon-av from Madison-st. to Manhattan drive; No. 143, on Hoover-av. from Wilder place easterly to end of old sewer on Davis-av from Wilder place to Hutchins-av., on Edgewood-av from Hoover-av. to Davis-av., on Third-st from Mosley-st. to Davis-av., on Hutchins-av. from Pauline-blvd. to Davis-av. No 144 Liberty-st. Washington-st. sub-main from Eighth-st. westerly to Buena Vista extended southerly and on Buena Vista-av. from sub-main northerly to Washington-st; No. 145, on all streets in Fair View Heights subdivision; No. 146 Huron-st West Park sub-main from Seventh-st to Doty-av. and on all streets in Westwood Hills subdivision; No. 147, on Wldwood av. from Huron-st. sub-main southerly 260 ft.; begs leave to report that we have had such estimates and reports as well as the resolution of Common Council under

consideration and have made due inquiries relating thereto and have heard all persons desiring to be heard in the premises, and your committee is of the opinion that there is necessity for the construction of said lateral sewers and sub-mains in said districts and recommends that special taxing or assessment districts be fixed by the Common Council upon and against which the construction of such sewers be charged, street intersections excepted and also such portion of sub-mains which the Common Council by ordinance may except, pursuant to the ordinance in such case made and provided. Your committee further recommends that resolutions fixing the boundaries of said districts be prepared by the city engineer and the board of public works ordered to advertise for the construction of said sewers.

We further recommend that the plans, specifications and preliminary estimates of cost for construction of storm sewers on Feich-st. from Allen's creek to Spring-st. and also from Ann Arbor railroad across private right of way to a point on Spring-st. 150 feet north of the north line of Hiscock-st. and on Spring-st. from Hiscock-st. to Walnut-st. and on Spring-st. from Miller-av. to Cherry-st., as approved by the Board of Public Works May 21 1924, and presented to Council June 2, 1924 be approved and the Board of Public Works be instructed to advertise for bids and proceed with the construction of said storm sewers according to the charter and ordinances governing same.

We further recommend that a storm sewer be constructed on Thompson-st. from Packard-st. to Cheever court and that a lateral sewer be constructed on Pauline boulevard from Fifth-st. to the city limits and that the City Engineer prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost of said storm and lateral sewers.

We further recommend that the construction of all the above named storm sewers and lateral sewers is hereby deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.

City Engineer certified that the petition to pave Thompson-st. between Liberty-st. and Packard-st. was signed by property owners owning a majority of the foot frontage.

#### Pavement Resolution By Ald. Norris

Whereas, this Common Council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the grading and paving of Thompson street between Liberty street and Packard street, within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and

Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of Thompson street, within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore, be it

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause said Thompson street, within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved under the charter and ordinance of the City of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows:
