Summary of Treasurer's Report

Report of Public Hearing on Proposed Amendments to Zoning Ordinance

To the Honorable, the Common Council.

Gentlemen:

A public hearing to consider proposals to amend, supplement or change the zoning ordinance the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, was held at the Council Chamber, City Hall, October 13, 1927, at 7:30 p. m., Eastern Standard Time, pursuant to notice adopted Common Council September by 26.1927, which said notice was . pub-Times lished in the Ann Arbor News September 27, 1927.

Meeting was called to order by

Alderman C. C. Freeman, Chairman of the Ordinance Committee, and the following members of Common Council were present: H. M. Slauson, E. E. Lucas, S. S. Hammial, W. J. Draper, C. C. Freeman, B. P. Woodbury.

Relative to proposal to change from Class "B" to Class "C" the west half of block bounded by Kingsley St., North Main St., Felch St. and North Ashley St., Sam C. Andres suggested that the whole block be included and Morris Kraizman expressed the opinion that the property abutting on Main St. in the next block north should be included in Class "C."

Emory A. Keppler, residing at 425 North Main St., objected to changing the west half of block

to business district.

Jacob Schild, 632 S. Ashley St., protested against changing his

property from Class "D."

Relative to proposal to change from Class "D" to Class "B" the property, one lot in depth, abutting on the east side of South Ashley St. between Madison St. and Mosley St., H. J. Finkbeiner, T. Hankins and C. T. Walker objected to proposed change, and a written protest was received from J. Fred Bross, et al.

J. Fred Rentschler, J. Edgar Dwyer, et al., spoke in favor of striking out that part of Section 8 of the zoning ordinance requiring a ten foot set back Class "C" district.

Lewis M. Gram, chairman Board of Appeals, called attention to certain property in the business district which would not be built up for business purposes for some states building time. In some lines are established onthose streets which it will be necessary to widen. There might be some advantage in vesting this with the Board of Appeals.

Alderman H. M. Slauson, member of the Board of Appeals, stated that the Board tried to act with justice to all parties. When the ordinance was passed, the question of zoning was new and it seemed wise to make no exceptions. If restrictions are removed it affects all parts of the City in same use district.

No objections were offered to

the other proposed changes.

Resolved, that, for reasons given below, this Common Council urges citizens of Ann Arbor to go to the polls on Tuesday, November 8, and vote in favor of issuing five hundred thousand dollars of water bonds.

1. The present spring water supply is not sufficient for the needs of our city. It is being supplemented by water drawn from the Huron river. If an additional supply of spring water is not secured more and more river water must be used.

2. The present reservoir is not sanitary and it is too small to afford protection in case of a large fire. A new sanitary and a larger

reservoir is a positive need.

3. The present distributing system is too small for the present needs of the city and will become increasingly so with the city's continued growth. Larger and more extended mains are necessary if satisfactory service is to be given.

4. These improvements are imperative, regardless of the question of filtration and water-softening.
