Ordinance Committee

Ald. Freeman presented the following ordinance which was given its third reading:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3 OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED. AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE CONSTRUCTION, ERECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF ILLUMINATED ELECTRIC SIGNS AND TO PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, PASSED SEPTEMBER 29, 1924; AND APPROVED SEPTEMBER 30, 1924.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor, Ordain:

That Section 3 of said Ordinance be amended to read as follows:

Section 3: All electric signs installed shall be thoroughly and

securely anchored to the building or other support in such manner as shall be declared necessary by the specifications of the said Board of Public Works. No electric sign shall be installed, the lower edge of which is less than ten (10) feet above the sidewalk, street, or alley, and at a distance not greater than two (2) feet from the building, measuring from the side of the sign nearest the building, nor shall the outside end of said sign extend beyond the curb line; no sign shall exceed 72 square feet in area, figuring one side; Provided, however, whenever the sign shall not exceed seven (7) feet six (6) inches in width; the area may be increased and the sign extended upward as far as necessary.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication thereof.

The Chair put the question, 'Shall this ordinance pass?'

Ald. Freeman presented the following ordinance which was given its third reading:

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO NAMING THE STREET RUNNING FROM THE NORTHEASTERLY LINE OF WASHTENAW AVENUE TO THE WESTERLY LINE OF FOREST AVENUE NOT HERETOFORE NAMED, AND CHANGING THE NAME OF VOLLAND STREET, FROM THE EAST LINE OF FOREST AVENUE TO THE WEST LINE OF OBSERVATORY STREET, ALL IN THE CITY OF ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That the name of the street running from the northeasterly line of Washtenaw Avenue between the South Department Hospital and the new Museum building to the westerly line of Forest Avenue, be and the same is hereby named North University Avenue, and the name of the street continued therefrom, to wit, from the east line of Forest Avenue to

the west line of Observatory Street, heretofore known and called Voland Street, be and the same is hereby changed and shall be hereafter known as North University Avenue.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after publication thereof.

The Chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Lateral Sewer Boundaries and Order of Assessments

By Ald Lucas:

Resolved, that the lateral sewer on Miner street from Pearl street north to the north end of Fred Heusel's property, known as district No. 171; on Elder boulevard and Lutz avenue and Madison street and outlet sanitary sewer, known as district No. 172; on Allen drive from Dexter avenue southerly, known as district No. 173; on Miner street from Felch street to Miller avenue, known as district No. 174; within the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, heretofore ordered in

the opinion of the Common Council are hereby declared and deemed to be expedient and to be necessary public improvements.

Resolved, further that all of the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned in each particular district are deemed and declared to be benefited by the construction and completion of the respective lateral sewers heretofore ordered and it is hereby ordered and determined that all of the costs of the said respective public improvements, street crossings excepted, shall be and are hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the respective special assessment districts hereinafter designated, and the said special assessment districts are hereby fixed as follows, to-wit:

District No. 171

The west 132 feet of lots 5, 6 and 7, Hiscock's Improved plat.

Lots 96, 97, 104, 105, 112, 113 and 120, Jas R. Gott's Second addition.

District No. 172

Lots 6, 7 and 8, Eberwhite addition.

Lots 143, 144, 152, 153, 154, 155, 156, 157, 158, 159, 160, 161, 162 and 163, Eberwhite First addition.

District No. 173

Lots 54, 57, 58, 61, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 88, 89, 90, 91, 92, 93 and 94, Grandview, subdivision of a portion of Sec. 30, T 2 S. R 6 E.

District No. 174

A parcel of land 99 feet deep abutting on the east side of Miner street and extending 84 feet northerly from the north line of lot 21, Stocking addition.

The north 100 feet of a parcel of land bounded on the east by Miner street; on the south by Miller avenue; on the west by DeVose and Bury land and on the north by People's Construction Company land.
