NOTES ABOUT THE DIRECTOR AND CAST

JERRY SANDLER... who is appearing in a double capacity in "Darkness at Noon," as a last-minute substitute in the part of Luigi for our hospitalized Bob Green, directed "The Dairy of Anne Frank" and "Major Barbara" for Civic Theatre last year, and played Willy Loman in "Death of a Salesman" two years ago. A producer-writer for University Broadcasting Service, Jerry is currently directing a series of five Greek dramas for nation-wide distribution. The first of these, Euripides' "Orestes," was broadcast over WUOM in April, and Sophocles' "Philoctetes" will be heard in November.

MERRILL McCLATCHEY . . . a former faculty member of the University of Michigan Department of Speech, is a writer and producer with the National Educational Television and Radio Center. Although this is his first Civic Theatre play, he has been seen by Ann Arbor audiences in the Drama Season and has done theatre work at Wayne, Columbia, and Wisconsin Universities.

JOSEPH MEDRANO . . . is also making his first appearance with Civic Theatre. A member of the Speech Department staff, he appeared in the summer productions "Annie Get Your Gun" and "Picnic." He has also worked with the Pontiac Civic Theatre.

RON SOSSI . . . is beginning his third year with Civic Theatre. He was in "Streetcar Named Desire," "Hasty Heart," and "Julius Caesar," and played the sailor in the Drama Season production of "Happy Birthday."

TOM JENNINGS . . . is familiar to Civic Theatre audiences for his performances in "Major Barbara" and "Wonderful Town." He is active in the Gilbert and Sullivan Society, and was in the Speech Department's production of "Annie Get Your Gun."

TOM LILLARD . . . received the Civic Theatre Oscar as Best Actor of 1959-60 for his performance as Stanley Kowalski in "Streetcar Named Desire." He played Fabrice in Civic Theatre's production of "Nude With Violin," and acted in the Drama Season production of "Tiger at the Gates."

NANCY HEUSEL . . . wife of director Ted Heusel, is winner of a Civic Theatre Oscar for Best Actress for her performance in "Tea and Sympathy."

FRED OUELLETTE . . a Board Member, won the Civic Theatre Oscar for Best Supporting Actor for 1959-60 for his performances as Mr. Dussel in "Diary of Anne Frank" and as Bill Walker in "Major Barbara." He also received the Graduate Study Club Award for Best Radio and TV Actor for 1958-59.

CARL GINGLES . . . former Board Member and active worker in Civic Theatre for the past ten years, was last seen on our stage as Lachie in "The Hasty Heart."

HELGA HOVER . . . Board Member and stalwart worker both backstage and on, was before the footlights last year in "Diary of Anne Frank" and "Wonderful Town."

CHARLES ISAACS . . . is back with Civic Theatre after a ten-year absence. During that time he worked with theatre groups in Alexandria, Virginia, and Clearwater, Florida.

ZEKE JABBOUR . . . Board Member and chairman of our season ticket drive, has appeared in "Diary of Anne Frank" and "Major Barbara."

JERRY PATTERSON . . . Managing Editor of The Education Digest, was seen by Civic Theatre audiences in "Diary of Anne Frank" and "The Night of January 16th."

ROBERT SEEMAN . . . has done backstage work for Civic Theatre. This is his first acting role with us.

IRWIN STARR . . . a senior in the University Speech Department, is making his first appearance before a Civic Theatre audience.

THOMAS HAYNIE . . . a physician at University Hospital, is another newcomer to Civic Theatre.

ALGER CRANDELL . . . a long-time member of Civic Theatre, is back on our stage after a year's absence to write a humorous book about the times, fifty years ago, now available at local bookstores.

MARY ANN STEVENSON . . . another Civic Theatre Board Member, acted in "Death of a Salesman" and played the female lead in "Hasty Heart."

PAHL MOORE . . . a University student in the Philosophy Department, is making his Civic Theatre debut.

RICHARD BARTELS . . . is a senior mathematics student at the University. This is his first Civic Theatre play.
