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From the Director

What a funny and wonderful show you will experience tonight! A throw-back to the golden era of American musical theatre, the show is based (very loosely) on Funny Face. And what an odd genesis for a modern musical to take!

The original misguided concept of the production (and the one that very few pre-Broadway audience members in Baltimore got to sample) involved a Peter Brooks directed Russian Constructionist image of America fused with Gershwin music (think about those covers of Ayn Rand books). On opening night out of town, Tommy Tune stepped forward, apologized to the audience, and set about fixing the musical. Brooks was out, Tune was in.

In one month, an entirely new book was written, songs were rewritten and rearranged, others added, sets completely redesigned, all choreography re-worked, and a sparkling "brand new" Gershwin show opened on Broadway to ecstatic reviews, standing ovations, and gave $42^{\rm nd}$ Street (then long running) a run for its money. Disaster being prevented, the show went on to win Tony and Grammy Awards, and received particularly warm praise for the pairing of Tommy Tune and Twiggy (yes, that Twiggy). Fortunate enough to be in NYC at the time, I saw the production five or six times while in grad school, and filed away the thought of the production for my own one day.

And then one day arrived. I am fortunate to have the talent involved in this production, and the wealth of talent in Ann Arbor and the local theatre region from which to draw. From the first tap steps at auditions (boy, did that separate the wheat from the chaff) to the final product on stage before you, this has been a tremendous team experience. The cast, crew, and production staff have been top notch.

I hope you leave the theatre with a song in your heart and a dance in your step. One caveat – no tap dancing allowed upstairs in the Balcony, please!
