

From the Director

I have always had A Thousand Clowns in the back of my head as a show I would like to do. First I was waiting for someone else to direct it so I could audition for it, but since that didn't happen I decided that I would have to direct it so it could be seen. It was a very popular show when it came out in the 60's, but it has not been widely produced in this area lately. Even though some of the dialog and the topics evoke the times when it was written, I think that the dilemma of Murray (the main character) is a timeless one. He has to decide between personal freedom and responsibility to others, in this case his nephew, Nick. Both of these issues were definitely brought under the microscope in the 60's with the counter culture trying to balance their desire for personal freedom with their feeling of responsibility for their fellow man and society in general. I have always thought of this play as kind of an anthem for those times.

There are a number of people I have to thank for getting this show up and running. On top are my production staff and my amazing cast (you can read their bios in a couple of pages), but there are some others that I also need to mention: Mike Goodale for his work on the poster and program design, Tom Steppe for photography and the Chuckles statue, Jeffrey Willets for composing the music for the Chuckles theme song and rounding up 47 5th graders to sing it, Wendy Raymond and Chris Hippler for audition help, Zac Johnson for music, and my producer, Joyce Casale, for keeping me mindful of the hundreds of things that needed my attention.

Enough from me, brush out your hair, put on that putty nose, inflate your shoes and get ready for *A Thousand Clowns*.

The Cast

Jimmy Dee Arnold (Murray Burns) Jimmy Dee is thrilled to be a part of this wonderful cast and crew and honored to be working again under TJ's direction. A Thousand Clowns marks his 85th show, and the 34th for A2CT, of which he has been a member since 1989. He'd like to appear in 100 plays before his final curtain falls. Among his favorite roles: Fagin in Oliver! (A2CT, 1991), Chino in West Side Story (A2CT, 1994), the Stage Manager in Our Town (Port Huron Little Civic Theatre, 1987), Raul in Extremities (St. Clair County Community College, 1987), and Partridge in Tom Jones (Harrington Dinner Theatre, 1982). To support his theater habit, Jimmy works as a pharmacy technician for U of M Health Systems HomeMed. Jimmy sends his love to his most patient and wonderful wife, Linda, and sons Jimmy Joseph (age 22) and James Edward (age 1).

Scott Bartz (Leo Herman) This is Scott's first appearance with Ann Arbor Civic Theatre. His acting experience includes a role in *The Sign of Jonah* and Tony in *Woman in Mind*. Scott teaches World Cultures at Wylie Elementary School in the Dexter Community Schools, where he instructs about 560 students throughout the course of a week. With the recent completion of his Masters in Education degree, Scott has found more time for his interests in yoga, theatre, swimming, vegan cooking and reading.

Bubbles (herself) was created by scenic designer/master carpenter Patrick McEvoy for the March, 2003, Monterey Peninsula College production of *A Thousand Clowns*. He found her in Beverly's Craft store alone, naked, and hairless. He brought her (and

her hair) back to the shop and added some champagne cork "enhancement" and also found her a grass skirt and built her pedestal. Master electrician Steve Retsky lovingly electrified her "enhancements" with the help of Radio Shack. Her performance got rave reviews in the Monterey press, and she stayed in the theater for over a year before someone inquired about her reprising her role in another theater. In the fall of 2004, she began a short international tour, appearing for three weeks in Newport Beach, CA, and then went directly on to an encore engagement in Toronto, Canada. She is excited to be appearing in Michigan, and thanks Ann Arbor Civic Theatre for another opportunity to travel and ply her trade.

Jon Elliott (Arnold Burns) marks his 15th A2CT production and 40th overall, in various roles as actor, director, stage crew, set crew, hunchback and fruit nut. Kudos to a fine cast and great crew (Yay, crew!), as well as to TJ's "Zen relaxation" directorial touch, and thanks to my supportive and loving family — Melissa, Jennifer, and Alexis. XOXO

Caroline Hippler (Sandra Markowitz) Caroline, born and raised in Ann Arbor, is a sophomore in the Residential College at the University of Michigan. 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
