

A lawyer by day and an omnivorous reader and moviegoer, Gordon has been a member of the group formerly known as UMGASS for 20 years and is currently in rehearsal for *HMS Pinafore*. He wants to thank his wife, Carol, his daughter, Jennifer, and his grandson, Gavin, for keeping the whimsy in his life.

ALEXANDRA BERNEIS (Harriet Fitzpatrick) is thrilled to be in her umpteenth show with A2CT. Alix has worked with A2CT for some time, having taken time to attend Denison University, where she earned her BFA in Theatre Performance. She has most recently been seen onstage in A2CT's Best Little Whorehouse in Texas and MCRT's Playboy of the Western World. His ambition is to direct Robert Bolt's A Man for all Seasons, in which he has played The Common Man in Kuwait, and the Duke of Norfolk in Antwerp. David would like to thank Jimmy Dee for taking a chance on him, and the cast and other members of A2CT for making him feel welcome.

ALAN P. BURK (Square) This is Alan's second show with A2CT after appearing as Melvin P. Thorpe in The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas. Alan attended Eastern Michigan University, where he majored in Theatre Arts and was a Literature minor (and happened to have read the original novel this play is based on!) England about 1750 Act One: Somersetshire Act Two: The Journey Act Three: London DAVID MELCHER (Highwayman/Swordfight Instructor) When David isn't performing or teaching theatrical combat, bullwhip stunts, high falls, or fire stunts, he leads a boring and uneventful life as a computer programmer. *Tom Jones* is his fourth A2CT production, and he is a 5-year member of the Ring of Steel stunt troupe. His other experience includes a swordfight role in Michigan Opera Theater's *Don Giovanni*, a lightsaber duel for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, and fight choreography and performance for several independent films.

BRENDA OELBAUM (Miss Western) This is Brenda's first production with A2CT. She has spent most of her time in the theater behind the scenes painting and building sets for the Burns Park Players. When Brenda is not fantasizing about acting, she is a visual artist and independent curator. She has two loving boys, two bad dogs and a husband who is none too excited about her making a fool of herself on stage. Too Bad! So Sad!

OLIVE THURSBY (Deborah) is delighted to be part of this show, her first with A2CT. Previously she did two plays in 2002 with St. Joseph's Twin City Players. She and her husband Ray live in Saline, have four sons, seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild. Olive would like to thank them for all their support.

RAYMOND THURSBY (Butler) Ray is enjoying being part of this show. It is his first venture onstage. Ray came to the U.S. from England in 1957 with his wife Olive and resides in saline. Ray has worked in the Public Health field in the UK, and USA and traveled extensively throughout Europe and Asia for the Ann Arbor - based NSF International before retiring. Hasty Heart was her first A2CT show, badly received by critics. She won a Best Supporting Actress award for both Bus Stop and The Crucible--obviously more perceptive critics. She was cast in A2CT's first original musical, Jerry Bilik's Brass and Grass. She couldn't sing on key, but was sleeping with the Producer at the time (and still is). Other productions with A2CT provided her with on-stage and offstage theatrical experiences. Mary Ann became a nationally known "Raconteuse" when UM still had a TV production studio (admittedly most of her fan mail was from 10-year-olds). As for this production of Tom Jones, she is happy--at last--to play a Troll!

MARIA VERMEULEN (Susan/Nancy) is thrilled for her first A2CT performance. She is a junior Film and Video Studies and Psychology major at the University of Michigan. Some past acting credits include Euripides': The Bacchae, Butterflies are Free, Stuck, Sleeping Beauty, Cheaper by the Dozen and Once Upon a Mattress. Maria spent this summer studying acting at the Lee Strasberg Theatre and Film Institute in New York City and appeared as an extra in As The World Turns and Spider Man: 3. 

IIMMY DEE ARNOLD (Director/Captain Blifil) is overwhelmed by and deeply enamored with this enthusiastically talented cast and crew assembled. Tom Iones marks limmy's 88th production in which has acted/sang/danced (or acted like he could dance and sing)/stage managed/worked backstage, etc. He is currently serving as a member of the Board of Directors. His directorial credits include The Scarlet Pimpernel (2003) and Extremities (1995) for A2CT, Arsenic & Old Lace (1993) for Dexter Players and The Wizard of Oz (1997), The Runaways (1984). Up the Down Staircase (1983) & All the World's a Stage (1981) Port Huron Little Theatre. He was most recently seen on stage as Murray in last season's A Thousand Clowns. Other favorite A2CT roles: Fagin in Oliver!, Carlton in Light up the Sky, Ouince in A Midsummer Night's Dream, & Ruckly in One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest. He sends his love to his wonderful family: the ever understanding and patient wife Linda, 21 month-old-son, James, soon-tobe-EMU-grad-son, Jimbo and Becca who will be his favorite daughter-in-law early next year.

CHUCK GRIFFIN (Stage Manager) wears many different hats when it comes to the theatre, and has been a familiar face at A2CT since 1995 when he built the set for Private Lives. His credits are many, and include such shows as Jeffrey, On Golden Pond, Ma Raney's Black Bottom, The Secret Garden, and Blithe Spirit. While his main interest is in set design and scenery painting/building, other interests are lighting, props, stage managing, stage crew, and on occasion he's been seen in the costume shop lending a hand when needed.
