Aaron Childs, one of the oldest and most respected citizens of the township, died August 25, 1882, at his residence in Alpena, Michigan. He was born at Henniker, Merrimack county, N. H., December 1, 1806. He was reared on a farm until he was 17 years of age, when he learned to weave woolen cloths in a factory at Petersburg where he remained five years, and then moved to Great Falls, N. H., where he carried on his business for one year. From this place he moved to Nashua, and remained there a short time, thence to Chautauque, N. Y., and a year after, in 1834, emigrated to Alpena county and in 1835 moved to Alpena on section 10. Mr. Childs assisted in the organization of Augusta township, the first meeting being held at his residence. He was elected clerk of the township for a considerable period. He was a member of the board of supervisors for 15 consecutive terms and postmaster of Alpena for a considerable length of time. In 1870 he was elected a member of the state legislature from this county for one term, consisting of two sessions. Politically he was a firm believer in the following principles: "The Union, the Constitution, and the rights of man." He was married to Hannah F. Bemis. His wife and five children survive him. William K. Childs, of Alpena, Michigan house of representatives, is at present a resident of this city.
