FROM THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

The undersigned the Board of Public Works do hereby report the several sidewalks by us constructed or repaired at the expense of the street fund of the city, during the year 1894, and since the 16th day of October, 1893, being the date of our last report and do hereby certify the cost and expense of the same as well as and also the description of the lands and premises in front of or adjacent to which the said several sidewalks were caused to be constructed or repaired as follows: that is to say.

On and along the south-easterly side of East University ave. in front of lot 51, Miller Addition, the property of Chas. E. Hiscock, 8 rods and  $8\frac{1}{4}$  feet at \$3.40 per rod. Amount \$28.95.

On and along the south-easterly side of East University ave., lot 85, Miller Addition, the property of Fred C. Brown, 8 rods at \$4.10 per rod. Amount, \$32.80.

On an along the south side of West Huron street.
