The Board are of the opinion that an injustice has been done to the laboring men during the past in this matter, that they have been required to pay an enormous discount for the purpose of getting their money once a week as they would if they worked for a private firm or corporation. We have been informed that the rate of interest has run from one to ten percent a month and in some cases as high as that for the use of money for one week.

In case this recommendation meets the approval of your Honorable Body, the City will be the looser of only three and one tenth per cent per year over that which they have already paid, and

would save any number of times this sum to the deserving leborer.
