ORDINANCE.

Ald. Stevens introduced the following Ordinance for its third reading:

An Ordinance relative to Street Pav-

ng, and to amend:

Section 7 of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance relative to street paving." passed on the 19th day of December, A. D. 1898, approved Dec. 23, 1898. The Common Council of the City of

Ann Arbor ordain.

Section 1. That section seven of an ordinance relative to street paving, passed December 19, 1898, and approved December 23, 1898, be and the same is hereby amended, to read as follows:

Section 7. After the certification of any such assessment district as provided in section six of this ordinance, the Common Council may at any regular meeting thereof by a resolution adopted by a majority of all the members elect, authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute under their hands and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor, bonds of the City of Ann Arbor payable to bearer in ten equal annual installments annually on or before the first day of March in each year thereafter, with interest not exceeding five per cent per annum payable annually in a sum or sums equal in amount to the estimated cost of the construction of any such pavement. All such bonds shall be known as "Pavement Bonds," and issued in series conforming to the number of the paving district on account of which any such bond shall have been issued. All which bonds shall be delivered by the City Clerk to the City Treasurer. Provided, that no than sixty thousand dollars in amount of any such bonds shall be outstanding at any one time.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after legal publication.

There being no amendments the ordinance was adopted as follows:
