

Streets has had under consideration plans and specifications for the pavement to be constructed on Huron street. The plans herewith presented are essentially as recommended by the Board of Public Works, and have been prepared by Engineer Key under the direction of the Chairman of your committee per your instructions.

The pavement is to be 53 feet wide from Ashley street west line to east line of Fifth avenue and 30 feet wide from thence to the east line of State street.

The sewer work includes the re-adjusting of the present manhole tops, inlets, etc., also the construction of the usual inlets, etc., at the Ashley street intersection.

The specifications are essentially the same as those of last year with a few modifications to admit the introduction of different sizes and kinds of material and a few other details made necessary by circumstances.

SIDEWALK GRADE RESOLUTION.

By Ald. Richards, Whereas, in the opinion of the Council the grade of the sidewalk on the east side of South Main street ought to be changed and fixed and established, to the end that such street

may be suitable for public travel. Therefore,

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the grade of the sidewalk on and along the east side of South Main street from south line of Huron street to the north line of Washington street be, and the same is hereby changed, fixed and established, so that the grade of said sidewalk on and along the street aforesaid shall be as follows, that is to say: At the south-east corner of Huron street and Main street 833.10 feet, at the north-east corner of Washington street and Main street 835 feet; the elevation given being above the official city datum and along the center line of such walk, and the grade lines to consist of straight lines between the several points or stations above stated.
