STREET COMMITTEE REPORT.

To the Common Council,
City of Ann Arbor, Mich.

Gentlemen:—

Your committee to whom was refer- red the matter of widening out Division street, between Madison and Hill Sts., have had the matter under consideration and beg leave to report the following: that, after a personal inspection, the committee cannot see that any great im- provement will be made by widening the street—and would therefore dis- approve of the same.

As to the matter of Tappan street, in reference to extension of the lawn your committee beg leave to report: after a personal inspection and after having a talk with a number of proper- ty owners on the street we agreed to compromise the request made by them in their petition. We would therefore recommend that the property owners on Tappan street, from Hill to Oak- land avenue be allowed to make an extension of two (2) feet on each side of the street, having a twenty-nine foot street, providing that the property own- ers will build a uniform cement gutter and curb-stone, subject to the approval of the Board of Public Works.

Whereas, in the opinion of the Coun- cil the grade of the sidewalk on the west side of S. First street ought to be changed and fixed and established, to the end that such street may be suita- ble for public travel. Therefore

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the grade of the sidewalk on and along the west side of S. First street from south line of West Washington street to the north line of West Liberty

street be, and the same is hereby changed, fixed and established, so that the grade of said sidewalk on and along the street aforesaid shall be as follows, that is to say:

At the S. W. corner of W. Washington street, 809.60.

At 139 ft. south of the S. W. corner of W. Washington street, 805.70.

At 267 ft. south of the S. W. corner of W. Washington street, 804.00.

At the N. W. corner of W. Liberty street, 804.00.

B. M. Brick Water Table, N. E. corner Michigan Milling Co's office, 807.38.

The elevation given being above the official city datum and along the center line of such walk, and the grade lines to consist of straight lines between the several points or stations above stated,
