The entire cost of this sewer paid by the city a short run of sewer was put in on Packard street and State street at a cost of \$347.68.

During the past year an addition has been built to what is commonly known as the Sixth Ward engine house. This addition became necessary when the fire department was enlarged. The following is a statement of the cost of this work.

In accordance with the orders of your Honorable body the house at the City Yards and the Second Ward Voting building were painted, at the cost of \$52.12. The Council Chamber was decorated at a cost of \$47.20.

Street signs were put up during the current year, at a total cost of \$158.75. Wall street bridge was painted, at a cost of \$31.50. The Seventh Ward building, for which you contracted, is nearing completion and should be ready for use at the coming election. No payments have been made on this work.

One thousand five hundred and three permits have been issued for connections with the sanitary sewer system, one hundred and twenty-five of which were issued during the present year. All this work has been inspected and either found in satisfactory condition or made so.

A considerable portion of the time of this office is taken up with the giving of grades, etc., for sidewalks. A list of walks for which grades were given would probably not be of interest to the general public, hence I omit that from this report.

To the Common Council:

Gentlemen:—The undersigned city clerk begs leave to submit the following report of the proceedings of the Board of Review of the special assessment rolls of lateral sewer districts No. 14, 15, 17 of the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

The Council sitting as such Board of Review, in pursuance to its order and appointment for that purpose, met at the council chamber on Tuesday, Dec. 26th, 1905, at 2 o'clock p. m. The roll was called of the aldermen and the following members were found present:

Present—Ald. Gill, Schlenker, Kearns, Miller, Markey, Sherk, Manwaring, Coon, Goodyear, Fischer and Abbott—11.

Ald. Coon was duly elected chairman for the Board of Review and the Council entered upon the review of said special assessment rolls. Due proof of the publication of notice of the meeting was filed. After hearing all persons desiring to be heard and completing the review of such special assessment rolls in lateral sewer districts No. 14, 15, 17 the following resolutions were offered.
