By Ald. Abbott—

Resolved, That we adjourn as a board of election canvassers and resume in session of common council. Adopted.

Ald. Miller—

Resolved, That the common council of the city of Ann Arbor at a regular session of the common council, at the council chambers in said city, on the sixth day of September A. D. 1906, found the proposition to bond the city for \$30,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a city hall and the purchase of land therefore. Carried.

Adopted by unanimous vote of council.

Resolution by Alderman Manwaring—

Whereas, This common council has by resolution proposed and determined to cause a city hall building to be constructed, and,

Whereas, The qualified electors of the city of Ann Arbor have authorized this council to raise the money for the construction of such city hall, and the purchase of land therefor, if deemed necessary, by a loan in a sum not to exceed \$30,000, and

Whereas, This common council deems

it necessary to purchase additional land for said purpose, now, therefore be it

Resolved, That this council hereby authorizes the mayor to accept the offer of William H. L. Rohde to sell lot known as No. 220 East Huron street, being 22 feet front and 132 feet long, adjoining the city lot on the west, in accordance with the terms of his offer dated August 18, 1906.

Resolved, Further, That the matter of said city hall building be referred to the board of public works, said board, with all convenient dispatch to determine as to the particular kind of material to be used for the construction thereof, and estimate in detail the quantity of material, the probable cost of the expense of such work and of the materials, and make a record thereof in their office, and cause to be prepared, so far as necessary, plans and specifications for such work and improvement, and report such determination, plans, specification and estimate to the common council as provided by the city charter.

Resolution by Ald. Abbott—

Whereas, This council has determined that it is expedient for this city to build and own a city hall, and has referred the matter of the plans, specifications and estimates therefor to the board of public works, as provided by the charter, and

Whereas, It is desirable, in order to avoid delay, that this council be enabled to take action immediately on receiving the report of said board, now, therefore,

Resolved, That the president appoint a committee of three whose duty it shall be to inform themselves as fully as may be concerning said proposed plans,

when determined by said board, to the end that the council may be better enabled to come to an immediate determination relative thereto on the coming in of said report. Adopted and following committee appointed: Ald. Abbott, Markey and Miller.
