Report of special committee on improvements. D. U. R. service in city. Ifon Common Council:

Gentlemen:-

After a thorough investigation, the committee appointed by the council on September 23rd, 1907, to consider the matters mentioned in the Mayor's communication with reference to improvements and changes by the Detroit United Railroad, we beg to submit the following report to this honorable body:

1st. The city cars should have the right of way on Main street, between William and Huron streets, or there should be a double track on Main street from William to Huron.

2nd. A conductor should be placed and kept on all cars throughout the whole journey, and should be required to call off the names of the streets as they are approached.

There should be a 15 minute 3rd. service on Packard street, as provided in the original franchise.

4th. Mileage books of all denom inations that are sold elsewhere should be on sale at the D. U. R Company's office here.

5th. Illuminated signs should be placed on all city cars at night.

6th. The old cars now being used on the city lines should be replaced by modern and uptodate cars.

7th. The lines should be extended

from the present terminus, near the Michigan Central Station, out Broadway to near Jones street.

An ordinance should be pass-8th. ed by the council requiring the D. U. R. to sprinkle the streets traversed by their lines in the dusty season. The committee also suggests that a line to the City's Hospitals would be a great benefit to the City and probably a paying investment for the Street Railway Co.

Gentlemen of the Council: I call your attention to the fact that the contingent fund, fire fund, police fund, water fund and street lighting fund show a deficit by liabilities actually contracted for and to be paid from said funds between now and July 1st, next. Therefore no money remains in the funds mentioned, available for further appropriations.

No expenditures can be made in excess of available money as shown in following report unless the council provides funds, which it can do in any manner permitted by the charter, or by cutting down any unexpended appropriation and returning the same to the credit of the fund from which it is drawn.

The deficits as shown were unavoidable on your part as they existed when the present council was organized and before the change of charter making it a part of my duties to exercise the powers and functions of a city comptroller was made by the legislature last June. My report made July 15th, last, will show this.
