declared to be a necessary public im-  
provement.

Resolved, further, that all the  
lands, tenements and premises herein-  
after mentioned are deemed and de-  
clared to be benefitted by the con-  
struction and completion of the pave-  
ment heretofore ordered and it is  
hereby ordered and determined that  
all the costs of the said public im-  
provement shall be and is hereby ord-  
ered to be levied on and assessed  
against the lands, tenements and  
premises situated in the special dis-  
trict assessment hereinafter designat-  
ed and the said special assessment dis-  
trict is hereby fixed as follows, to wit:

All those certain pieces and parcels
